


Conservation Halton releases 2003 edition of nature book

The Conservation Halton Foundation launched the 2003 edition of its book Halton: Rising, Wild and Beckoning at the Halton Region Museum last week.

The revised book includes 175 photos, 17 trail maps and driving tours and a new chapter of wildlife.

"More than 12,000 books have been sold since 1998, with almost \$300,000 raised for conservation specifically for the renovation and expansion of the Visitors' Centre located at the Mountsberg Conservation Area," said Brian Penman, book committee chairman.
