A cure for the coming cold



Instead, he counsels homeowners to check their fuse box for a faulty fuse or breaker, or check that their furnace power switch is turned to the "on" position, or check to see if the thermostat needs new batteries. If that doesn't get your furnace working, he suggests calling a licensed heating



contractor.

- Hazardous debris in the chimney and flue

 - Clean burners
 - Gas piping to furnace
