

close examination of the October 2 provincial election polling results for the Halton Ariding reveals that of the 33,610 votes incumbent MPP Ted Chudleigh received to capture a third consecutive seat, about 31 per cent came from Halton Hills.

The Halton election ended up being a two-horse race between Chudleigh and Liberal challenger

Barbara Sullivan, a former Halton Centre MPP between 1987 and 1995. And the polling numbers seem to suggest Halton Hills proved instrumental in helping Chudleigh threepeat as an MPP.

Of the 28,112 official votes Sullivan garnered in the election, Halton Hills accounted for 24 per

cent of her total support. The large Halton riding is comprised of Halton Hills— the most

populated area in the riding— as well as Milton and northern portions of Burlington and Oakville.

The kind of response Chudleigh received from Halton Hills isn't surprising given the area is largely rural, said Henry Jacek, a political scientist with McMaster University. He said the Tory platform speaks to a lot of people who are involved in the farming industry, which is big business in Ontario.

In 1995, the Mike Harris-led Tories introduced legislation that prohibits farm workers from joining a union.

Aside from Halton Hills, the rest of the riding proved to be a tough, close race.

In Milton, votes for Chudleigh made up about 26 per cent of his total support, while for Sullivan, Milton voters made up 25 per cent.

Sullivan enjoyed her greatest success in Oakville portions of the riding, where she received some 400 more votes than Chudleigh.


Of the approximately 121,000 eligible voters in the Halton riding, 70,079 turned out to vote on election night. That amounted to a 54 per cent voter turnout, which was slightly above the Ontario average of 52 per cent.

The returning office doesn't break down the exact number of eligible voters in each municipality within a provincial riding.
