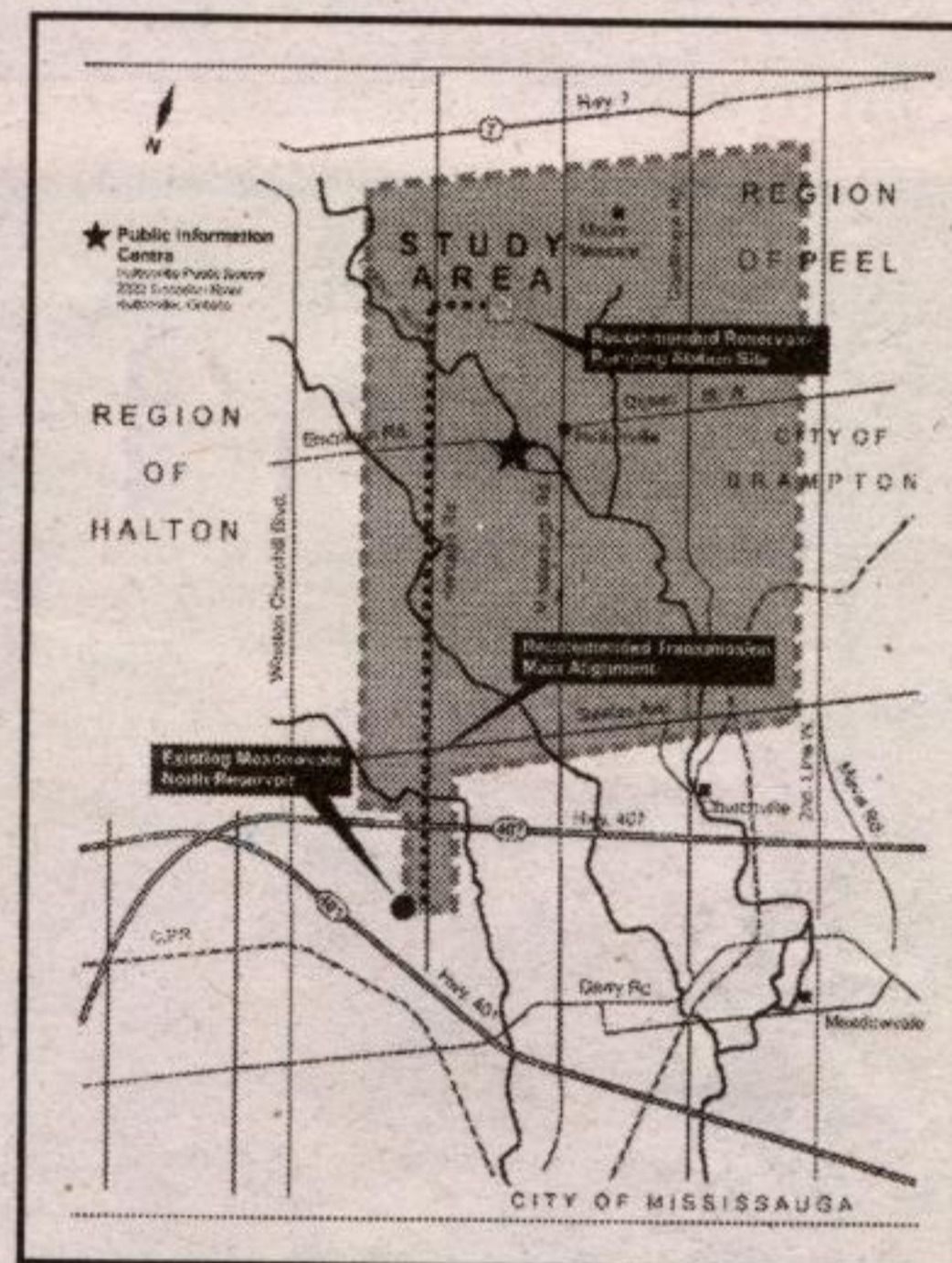
**The Study**

The Region of Peel, through their consultants Earth Tech Canada, has initiated a study for identifying a suitable site for the West Brampton Reservoir and Pumping Station and alignment for the West Brampton Transmission Main to connect into the existing Meadowvale North Reservoir (see map). The Region's Water and Wastewater Servicing Master Plan, May 1999, has identified the need to construct these water facilities in the Cities of Mississauga and Brampton to meet the demands of future development in West Peel.

**The Process**

The study is being conducted in accordance with the approved requirements of a Schedule "C" project of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (2000) (Class EA). The Class EA process includes public and review agency consultation, an evaluation of alternatives, an assessment of the impacts of the proposed improvements, and identification of measures to mitigate any adverse impacts.

A Public Information Centre (PIC) was held on February 6, 2003 for this project to present the preliminary results to date, including the need and justification for the project, recommended solution, and the alternative sites and alignments under consideration for public comment. Input received was considered and included in the evaluation of alignments and sites resulting in the identification of a recommended transmission main alignment and reservoir/pumping station location.



**Recommended Alignment and Site**

Beginning at the existing Meadowvale North Reservoir, the recommended transmission main alignment would follow Heritage Road north to the recommended reservoir/pumping station site situated east of Heritage Road between Highway 7 and Embleton Road (see map).

**Public Information Centre No. 2**

The Region of Peel is planning to hold the second of two (2) Public Information Centres (PICs) in accordance with the Class EA planning process. PIC No. 2 will present the results of the evaluation process including the recommended transmission main alignment and reservoir/pumping station site. Attendees will have the opportunity to discuss their comments directly with Region of Peel and Earth Tech Canada staff. PIC No. 2 is scheduled for:

Following this, an Environmental Study Report documenting the process will be submitted to the Ministry of Environment and will be available for public review. Public notification will be given at that time.
