carriage through a course without knocking over cones that give only 15 centimetres of leeway on either side of the carriage. The event is timed and penalties are assessed for knocking over cones.

Marathon is a test of the horse's stamina and agility and the driver's skills. A cross-country course is set up with series of challenging obstacles and hazards. The driver must lead the horse through a complicated and challenging set up in a ring that force the driver and horse to make tight turns at high speeds.

Though MacGillivray prefers the combined events, she said pleasure driving is a nice change of pace.

"I look at pleasure driving as a change," MacGillivray said. "You get to be all fancy."

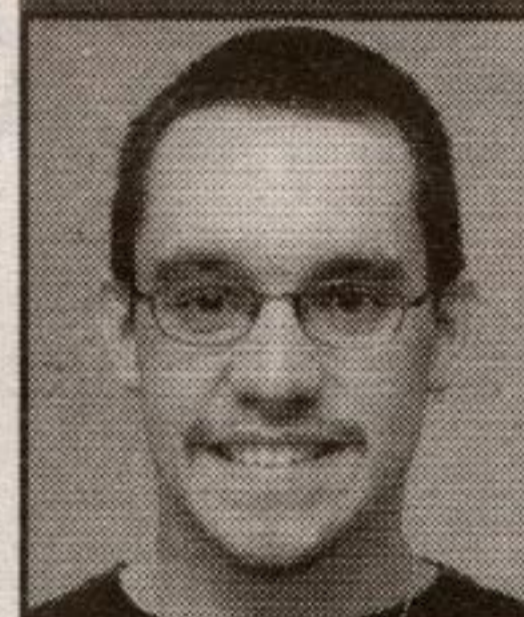
Novice Hurricanes
