Break-in suspect nabbed in bank

A Georgetown man is facing charges in connection with an incident at the CIBC on Main St. early Sunday. Police report entry was gained into the bank after a window was broken, the teller area was ransacked and computers and photocopiers were damaged. Police responded and arrested a man found in the bank who had two steak knives on him.

Charged with break and enter and weapons dangerous is Sean Reynolds, 20, of Cedarvale Court.

Halton Police report two front tires were stolen from a backhoe parked at a construction site at Meadow Glen Blvd. and Mountainview Rd. late Wednesday or early Thursday. The tires are valued at \$4,600.

Approximately \$20,000 damage was caused to 80 metres of freshly formed concrete curb at Brian Moore Dr. and Wallace St. in Acton late Thursday or early Friday.

Police are investigating a suspicious fire in a 1987 Dodge Caravan parked at Halton Hills Radiator on Guelph St. late last Tuesday. The van, valued at \$1,000, was destroyed. Police report two young males were seen fleeing the fire.

A cardboard cutout of Harrison Ford, valued at \$30, was taken from the front foyer of Jumbo Video on Guelph St. at 9:15 p.m. Saturday. Police report the person who took it was seen leaving in a dark car similar to a Chevrolet Cavalier.

Police report six golf carts were found parked throughout North Halton Golf Course

and the grounds were damaged sometime Saturday morning. Damage is estimated at \$4,000.

An \$800 corner tub was taken from a house under construction on Dawkins Cr. sometime between Tuesday and Friday. Entry was gained through the garage door.

Approximately \$1,900 worth of items were taken from a vehicle parked outside of a Main St. Georgetown residence late Friday and early Saturday. Taken was a stereo, cash, a jacket and CDs.

Advance poll turnouts high

If the turnout for the first advance poll is any indication, voter turnout may be significantly higher for the upcoming municipal election than it was in 2000.

Town clerk Karen Landry reported Tuesday that turnout for the first advance poll in 2000 was approximately 508 electors. She said voter turnout Saturday for the first advance poll of this year's election was nearly double that, at 946.

The final advance poll will be held today (Wednesday) from noon to 8 p.m. Ward 1 residents can cast their vote early at Acton Legion, Wards 1 and 2 residents at Acton Arena, Wards 2, 3, and 4 residents at the Civic Centre and Wards 1, 2, 3, and 4 residents at Georgetown Market Place.

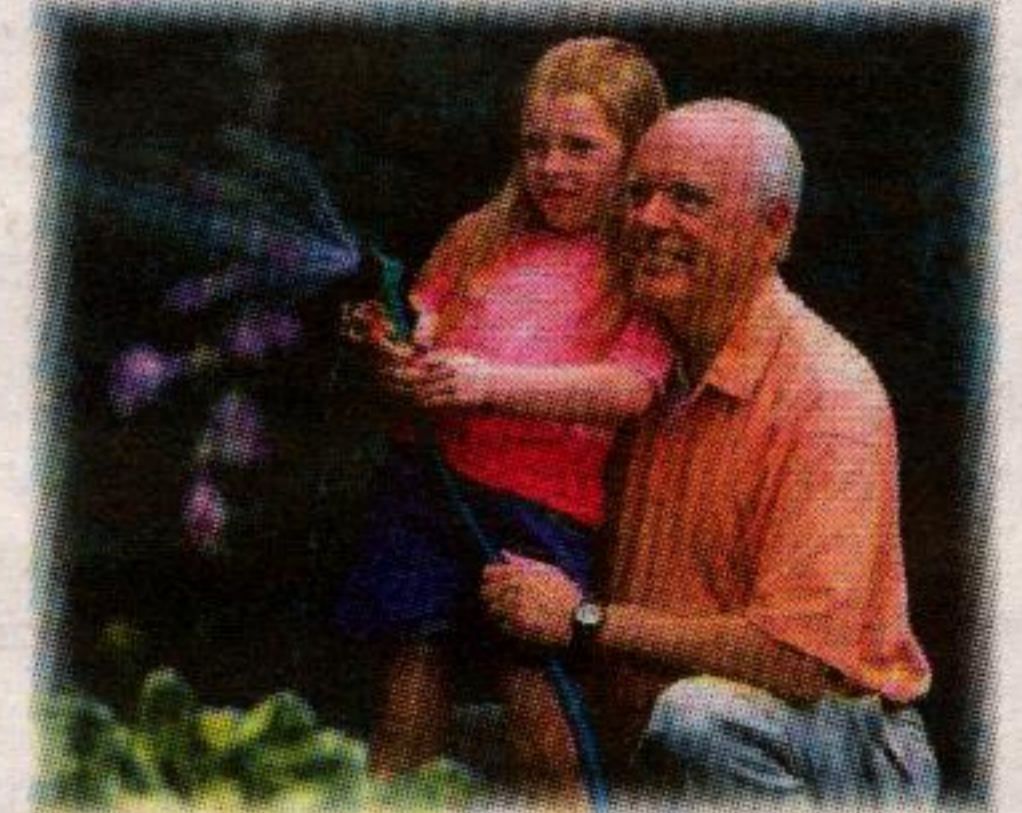

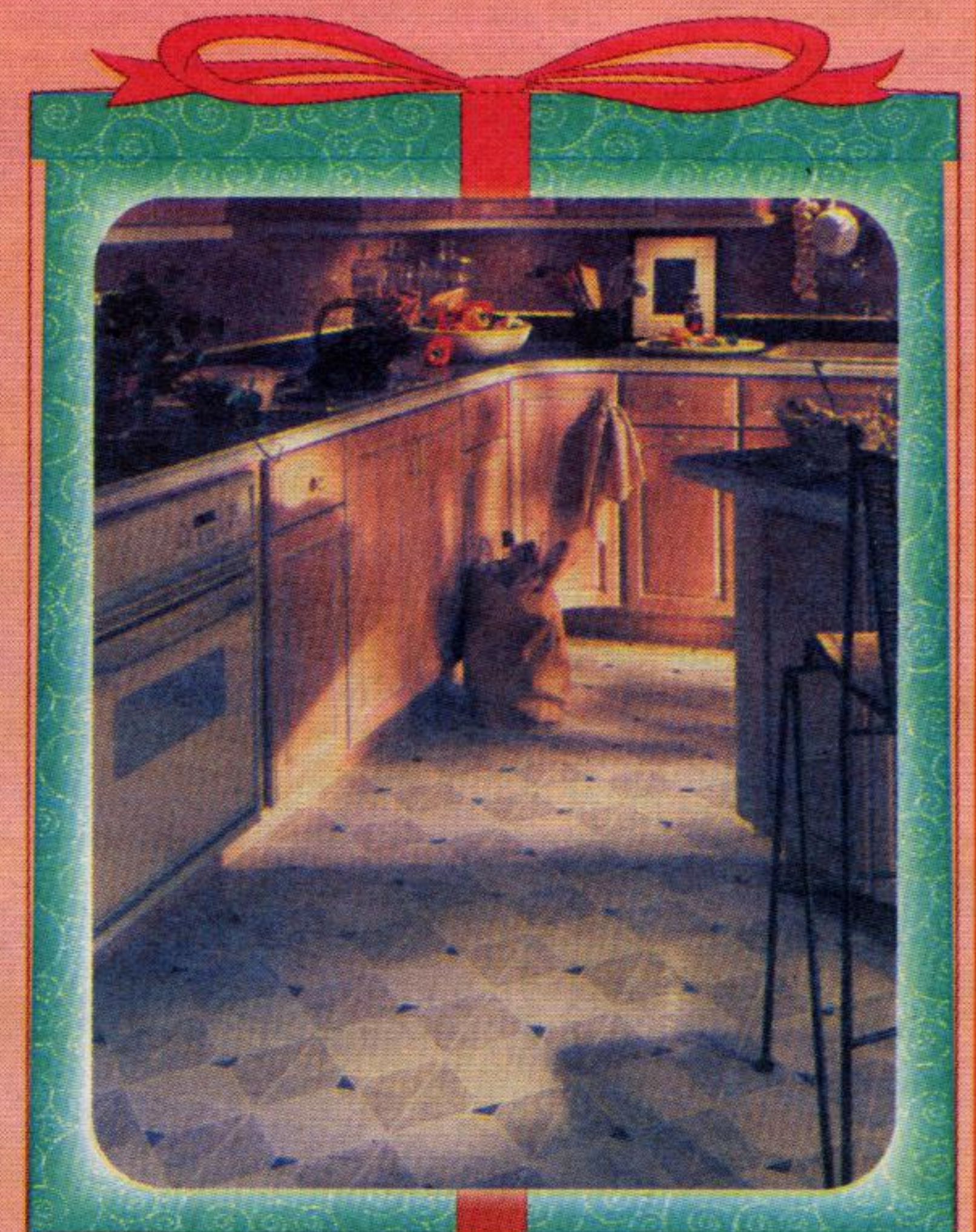
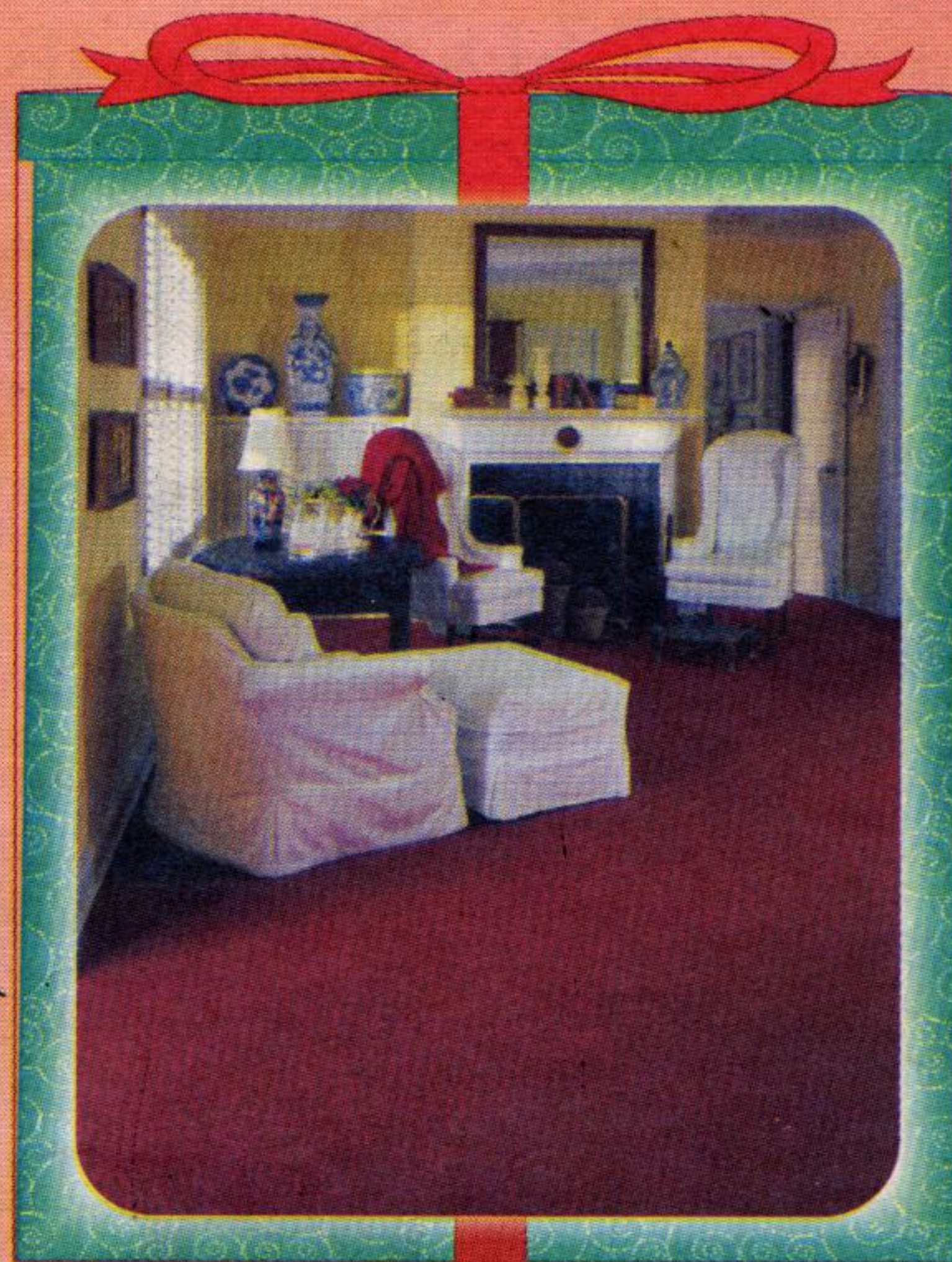
