Houses on the tour include two in Acton, two in Glen Williams, one in Norval and another in Georgetown.

Moorecroft, a Queen Annestyle home built in 1896 and located on Church St. E. in Acton, will be one of the homes on the tour. It is decorated by Decorating Den, and the florist is Blue Springs Flower Shop.

Another home on the tour located on 25 Sideroad in Acton, is an early French-Canadian-style stone farmhouse nestled in old growth cedars. Deocrating will be done by Bos Interiors and

Windswept Florists. One of the Glen Williams homes on the tour, located on McMaster St., is a 1910 late Victorian reproduction home decorated by Blossoms Up Inc. and Garden Gate Florist. The other home in the Glen, on Main St., was designed to harmonize

with the existing century homes in the area and features soaring views of the countryside. It is decorated by Joan Robson Interior Design and the florist is CW Horticultural.

The Norval home featured, located on Guelph St., is a 1912 Edwardian-style house that has 10-foot ceilings, wide halls and lots of wood and stained glass windows. The decorator for this home is Robert Hurst, and the florist is Garden Gate Florist.


A Samuel Cr. Georgetown South home on the tour is well known for its summer gardens and outdoor Christmas lighting. Fran Quart is the decorator of




