Grade 6 students will compete in show jumping event tomorrow


ean Jobin and Jessica Whitton will be getting the Royal treatment this weekend.



While she's put a lot of work into her riding, she had to put a bit of work into just getting on a horse for the first time four years ago.

"My cousin was riding horses and I kept begging mom to let me ride," she said. "At first she said no but I kept begging and finally she let me," Whitton said.

Whitton has qualified two horses, Crossroads Fast Eddie and Sunny. She enjoys riding both horses but said Eddie is more experienced.

Jobin began riding two years ago. He qualified on three horses in the small pony division-finishing sixth, ninth and 12th—but can only ride two at the Royal Winter Fair.

"They're all pretty fun to ride," he said.

Still, he had to decide and picked Bayview Better Be Sharp and Bayview High Hope.

Jobin said he does get a little nervous before competitions and the Royal Winter Fair will be no exception.

Both riders train with Scott and Anne McKay at Greenhaven in Limehouse. The next step for them will be attempting to qualify for the Young Riders Canada program.

Charged with attempted break and enter, two counts of break and enter commit theft, and three counts of breach of probation is Brian Hendry, 25, of Beverly St.


Two youths from Hamilton are facing charges after police pursued a vehicle from Milton to Steeles Ave. and Eighth Line early last Friday.
