

More than two million Canadians have diabetes. The disease occurs when the pancreas is unable to produce any or insufficient insulin, or when the body does not effectively use the insulin that has been produced. Diabetes is very serious if it is not managed properly. The high level of blood sugar will slowly damage small and large blood vessels in the body. This

results in many complications. Heart disease, blindness, non-traumatic limb amputations and kidney disease are some of the complications of diabetes.
