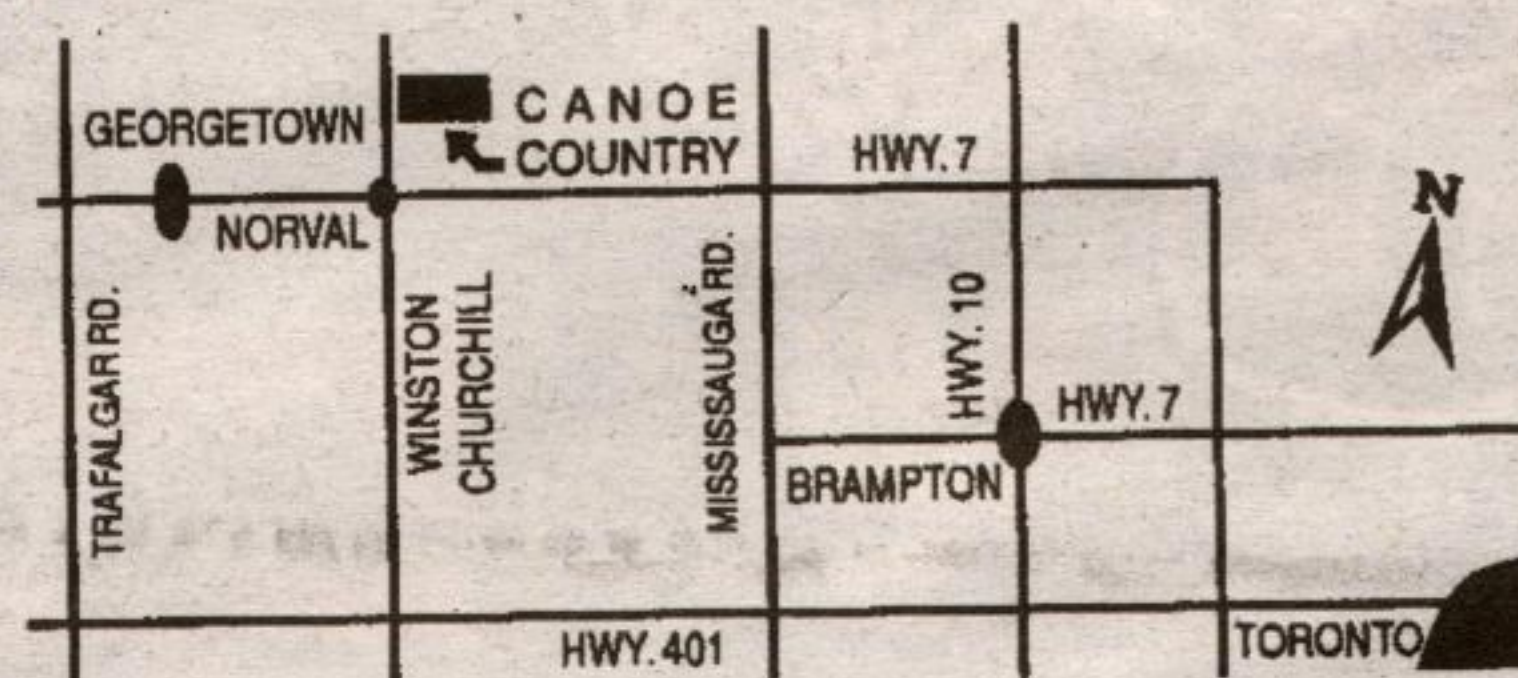


HORSE & CARRIAGE RIDES
