Hill said it felt no different than any other game until the first time they played the Cubans. Prior to the game, the Canadian anthem was played for the first time. As it was being played there was a strong wind, but only the Canadian flag was blowing.

"All of sudden you realize you're not there for any old game. It means something. You're playing hard to represent your country."

With the Americans, the defending Olympic gold medallists, being upset by Mexico in the semifinals at the qualifying tournament, Canada's medal hopes improved dra-

matically. Taiwan, Japan and Cuba will head into the tournament as the favourites but Canada will be the biggest threat to knock one of them off the podium. And Hill knows anything can happen.

"You look at 1999 when (Canada) killed everybody and came away with nothing," Hill said of the Pan Am Games when Canada posted the best record in the round-robin, only to be eliminated in the playoffs. "All you need is for a pitcher to have a good game like Mexico did against the U.S."

Hill certainly wouldn't mind being that pitcher.
