
At Brampton tourney Rebels rally to top Lord Elgin

The Georgetown Rebels scored six unanswered points to defeat Lord Elgin 40-34 and win the d'Youville Invitational Basketball Tournament in

Brampton last weekend.

The Rebels took a 22-15 into the half and led by as many as 12 points but Lord Elgin fought back to tie the game 34-34. Ted Morris stole the ball and fed Andrew Robitaille for a basket with 2:05 to play to put the Rebels ahead to stay.

Robitaille led the Rebels with 14 points



while Morris had 11 points, six steals and eight rebounds.

The Rebels opened the tournament with a thrilling 39-37 win over the host d'Youville Panthers, winning the game on Morris' jump shot at the buzzer. Georgetown trailed by three in the final minute but Morris hit a three-pointer from the top of the key to tie the game with 20 seconds remaining.

After a John Pettit steal gave the Rebels possession, he inbounded the ball to Morris with 1.6 seconds to play. Morris dribbled once and then hit a fade-away jumper from 15 feet out as the buzzer sounded.

Georgetown trailed 11-6 after the opening quarter but held the Panthers to just two points in the second quarter to take an 18-13 lead into the half. With a much deeper bench, d'Youville took a 37-30 lead with 3:41 remaining.

But the Rebels rallied after some timeouts to catch their breath.

Morris led the Rebels with 15 points while Mitch Edwards contributed 10. Pat Beswick topped the team with nine rebounds.

The Rebels will play in a tournament this weekend in Vernon-Verona-Sherrill in upstate New York.


The Raiders went to Lakeshore Arena to watch the Maple Leafs' practice and follow-
