Candlelight Tribute to honour veterans set for Friday

or the second consecutive year both Halton Hills branches of the Royal Canadian Legion will be hosting a Candlelight Tribute in memory of our veterans, commemorating Victory in Europe (VE) Day.

Organized for Friday, May 7, the tribute will feature a morning processional with school children placing candles (in enclosed containers) as they did last year. This year, twice as many students will take part in the walk— 50 from each school, instead of 25.


In Georgetown, the students will file from the fairgrounds on Charles St., up to the Remembrance Park cenotaph at the corner of James and Charles, where they will place the candles on the cenotaph, as well as shake hands with any veterans in attendance who will be lined up along the exit walkway of the park.

In the evening, any local residents who wish to take part in the Silent Walk will have an opportunity at 6:30 p.m., when they will depart from Cedarvale Park and walk up Main St. to Remembrance Park. Following the placing of the candles, the participants will be able to meet with the veterans at a reception at Branch 120 of the Royal Canadian Legion on Mill St.

In Acton, the Silent Walk will start at 7 p.m., with students and residents converging on the cenotaph in front of Trinity United Church, from both sides of

As in the Georgetown walk, 50 students from each of the four schools in Acton will be taking part. Following the placing of candles at the cenotaph, everyone is invited to a reception at Branch 197 of the Royal Canadian Legion in Acton to meet with the veterans.
