NEW THE WINE PRESS

WINE can be made from hundreds of fruits and plants, but grapes are preferred for their vibrant colours, juiciness and sweetness. Grapes also have the correct balance of sugar and acids to promote fermentation - the natural process that turns grape juice to wine. During fermentation the sugars in the grape juice are converted by yeast enzymes into alcohol, carbon dioxide, and numerous natural compounds namely tannins, minerals and acids which affect the colour and taste. Fermentation ceases when the alcohol level has reached 12 to 14% and becomes intolerable to the yeast. A typical bottle of wine is 84% water, 12% alcohol and 4% natural compounds.
