Andrews unbeaten in shot put, discus

Kaitlyn Andrews remained undefeated in the shot put and discus, winning both events at the ridgeway Crystal Beach Track and Field meet.

Andrews won the junior girls shot put with a distance of 11.48m and took first in the javelin with a toss of 33.71m. She also finished second in the javelin with a throw of 27.09m.

Dan Woolford made it a sweep for Acton in the junior shot put, winning the boys event with a toss of 13.55m. He was second in the discus with a throw of 45.10m.

Jaimi Fellows earned a fourth place finish in the midget girls high jump, clearing 1.30m.

Other top finishers at the meet included Troy Ethier (5th senior boys triple jump); Amy De La Franier (5th junior girls 300m hurdles); Norm Tosh (6th junior boys shot put); Ashton Roza (7th open boys 3000m); Kyle Sutherland (12th open boys 3000m).

The Acton Bearcats senior girls soccer team won their third straight game, downing E.C. Drury 5-1 Tuesday. Katie Banks and Melissa Bigg each scored twice for Acton and Amy Boileau had the other goal.

Warriors capture bronze at own tournament

The Wellington Warriors took an early lead and never looked back as they went on to defeat Grimsby 60-38 and win the bronze medal at their own basketball tournament.

The Warriors staked themselves to a 19-7 lead in the opening quarter and increased that to 33-14 by the half. Emma Carter earned player of the game honours for the Warriors with six points and 10 rebounds.

It was the second bronze medal for the Warriors this season.

Wellington opened the tournament with a narrow 36-35 win over Peterborough. The Warriors took a 10-point lead into the fourth quarter of the opener but Peterborough rallied to tie the game in the final minute. The Warriors set up a final shot but Keisha Powell was fouled. She capitalized on the free throw to give Wellington a 36-35 win.

The Warriors used a strong third-quarter to win their next game. Leading 21-19 at the half, Wellington held Grimsby to just four points in the quarter to stretch its lead to 32-23. Adrienne Thompson had an outstanding game with 18 points and 16 rebounds.

Wellington ran its winning streak to three with a 51-32 win over Barrie, led by Cristy Nurse's second straight double-double. She had 15 points and 15 rebounds.

Advancing to the semifinals, the Warriors met Etobicoke. Trailing by as much as 12, Wellington fought back to within a point. With time running out, Wellington was forced into fouling its opponenets, allowing Etobicoke to pull away.
