
really adventuresome and make a complete disaster out of the kitchen, this is not a relaxing situation for your loved one

Sesame Chicken Wings

Ingredients

- 1 cup soy sauce
- 1 cup chopped green onions
- 1/2 cup white vinegar
- 3 tbsp honey
- 2 tbsp peeled, chopped fresh ginger
- 2 tbsp chopped garlic
- 2 tbsp oriental sesame oil
- 20 whole chicken wings, tips cut off

Method

1.Mix first seven ingredients in a large bowl. Stir in chicken. Cover, chill at least two hours and up to one day, stirring occasionally.

2. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Arrange wings on two baking sheets. Pour marinade into small saucepan; reserve. Roast wings until tender and glazed, turning and basting occasionally with marinade, about one hour.

3. Arrange wings on large platter. Boil reserved marinade until slightly thickened (it is very important that it comes to a boil and remains boiling for at least five minutes). Pour into a bowl. Serve wings with marinade as dipping sauce.
