Turn off the lights: By turning off large outdoor lights and main interior lights when you leave a room, you can significantly reduce your daily power consumption.

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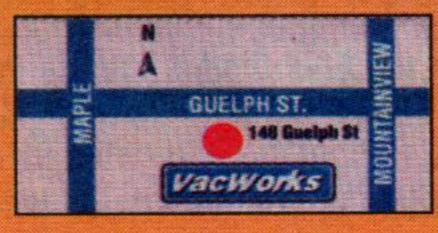
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
