Staff fear for hospital's future

the pending closure of the obstetrics and pediatrics departments at Georgetown hospital has upset many doctors and nurses who work there, and some fear it could lead to further erosion of services at the hospital.

"This is the first brick out of the wall," said one nurse, who did not want to be identified.

She said the removal of obstetrics from William Osler's Georgetown campus, slated for July 5, will have a domino effect on other departments.

For example, she said, the loss of obstetrics will impact the anaesthetists as much of their on-call income is related to obstetrics. She said without that work, there is a risk they could leave, which would then impact surgery, as the surgeon couldn't perform his services without anesthetists, and if the surgeon and anesthetists leave, that would negatively impact the emergency department.
