

Former Raider Knoepfli named Cornell's captain

There will be a little extra material on Mike Knoepfli's sweater when he returns to the Cornell Big Red for his final season, but he doesn't think it will weigh him down.

Knoepfli will be wearing a big red C after being voted team captain for next season by his teammates.

"I was put in a bit of a leadership role this year and I'm excited to be named captain,". Knoepfli said. "It means a lot more to me and the guys (named assistants) that it was voted on by our teammates."

Joining Knoepfli as assistants will be Charlie Cook, Mike Iggulden and Matt Moulson.

Knoepfli, who has played 98 games over

his first three seasons, said there is a void to fill with captain Ryan Vesce leaving.

"Now that I'm a senior, there will be people looking up to myself. I'll have to be more vocal in the dressing room but I've always tried to do that."

Coach Mike Schaefer, himself a former assistant captain at Cornell, said the captaincy should not be a dramatic change for Knoepfli.

"There's always an adjustment period and sometimes you maybe you think you have to do it all," Schaefer said. "What you need to do is all the things you were doing before that got you the votes."

Knoepfli had eight goals and 24 points in
