Dunning wins marathon

It wasn't what she was hoping for but it wasn't too bad of a Lonsolation prize for Martie Dunning.

The 37-year-old Georgetown native was the first woman across the finish line at the inaugural Mississauga Marathon Sunday in a time of three hours, two minutes and 22 seconds. Dunning took over the lead at the halfway mark and never looked back, winning by more than six minutes. But she would have preferred to reach a personal goal that has eluded her since she began running marathons seven years ago.

"It wasn't even about winning," Dunning said. "It was about breaking three-hour mark. Ultimately, it's about you pushing yourself to finish. I'd have rather finished last and broken three hours."

Still, winning the closest event to

home proved to be special.

"I had a lot of support from friends and family and that was really nice," she said. "I loved the course and the people cheering you on along the way was awesome. It felt great. To win was is just a bonus."

It was the second win of Dunning's marathon career, having won in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania in 2002. She started running as a way to keep in shape for hockey. Sunday she outran all 488 women entered.

The win also came in the city where Dunning co-owns The Long Run with her coach Steven Keating.

"He's been a phenomenal coach through all my whining and crying," Dunning said. "Any success I've had has been because of him."

Dunning will take another crack at the three-hour mark at the Toronto Marathon in October.


