## AHS to host film festival

Three celebrity judges will critique films produced by students at Acton High School at the school's first film festival on June 3.

Math teacher Jen Ross, who helped organize the festival, said she called in a few favours to coax the judges away from their regular jobs in the film industry, to view and critique the students' work.

"It's so valuable for the students to have professionals review their films," Ross said, adding the festival is less of a competition and more of a student learning experience.

There will be 11 films, ranging from two to 20 minutes in length.

Andrew Grant is an animator who helped bring the Jar Jar Binx character to life in the George Lucas epic *Star Wars Episode 1*. James Motluk is a Toronto documentary filmmaker whose latest film *Life Under Mike* chronicles the changes made under the Mike Harris government.

Ken Walker teaches in the anima-

tion department at Sheridan College.

Grade 12 student Laura Stevenson has been the driving force behind the festival, Ross said, and credits Stevenson with drumming up interest among the students.

Stevenson said a number of her peers are heading to college or university in the fall to study film, and thought a film festival would provide them with what they need most — an audience.

"I think it will bring a little culture to the school, and encourage culture in the school," Stevenson said.

The films are of broad and varied interest — a mockumentary of a rock group, a documentary of the Relay For Life cancer fund-raiser held at the school May 14, music videos and even a few silent films.

The festival begins at 7 p.m. in the school's cafeteria. Tickets are \$5 per person and are available at the door. For more information, call the school at 519-853-2920.
