ADJUSTING TO NEW DENTURES FEEL

At first your new dentures might feel very large in your mouth. You may even experience a gag reaction. This is normal in the beginning. In time, with a little patience and practice, you will adjust naturally to this initial fullness and barely notice it in your mouth.

SPEECH

Many new denture wearers have difficulty at first with their speech. Words containing "S" sounds can be a problem. Practicing speech aloud with your new dentures in place will help restore your normal speaking quality. Try reading aloud from a book or magazine in front of the mirror. This will help you to get used to the new speaking position of your tongue and new denture. This will also give you more confidence. Also, before you speak, it is helpful to first bite and swallow. This will "set" the dentures in position and improve clarity.

EXCESS SALIVA

When you first receive your new dentures, you will probably notice an increase in the flow of saliva in your mouth. This is a normal response to the unfamiliar new denture. On the average, most people swallow about 600 times a day. For the first few days after receiving your new teeth, you should try to swallow more frequently. After a few days have passed, your mouth will become used to the denture, and saliva flow will return to normal.

Nervous new students might find comfort in reading Annabelle Swift, Kindergartner by Amy Schwartz. In this book Annabelle overcomes her initial mistakes and embarrassment to become her school's first kindergarten milk monitor.

Georgetown carpet bowlers earn gold at Senior Games

Thile most Ontarians were spending their leisure time watching the Olympians compete at the world level, 44 seniors from Halton were in St. Catharines competing in the Ontario Senior Games Association's Actifest 2004.

The 44-person contingent from across Halton Region managed to win a record four gold medals and one bronze medal.

Victorious in the carpet bowling event were Marilyn Mason and Gwen Wenham of Georgetown. The gold medal winner for low handicap golf was

George Stoddart of Burlington. The men's 65+ tennis doubles winners were Tony Schafer and Gary Gregson of Burlington. In the three-person lawn bowling battle, Burlington's Albert McClure, Ron Du Feu and John Tennant finished the two days with the best record.

Anne De Groot of Georgetown was fifth in swimming. Halton had entered 25 of the 33 Actifest events including all of the four card games. The results in this area were a little disappointing as they ranged from 16th to the lower half of the fields.

This biannual competition brought 1,400 seniors from across Ontario together as the winners of competitions at the 40 allocated districts. St. Catharines had bid for the Actifest and had spent over a year assembling the staff and over the 300 volunteers that it takes to host this event. The participants were housed in Brock University residences.

Most of the meals and some of the events were held at the university. Various clubs around the city loaned their facilities for their respective games.
