## Rep soccer roundup Under-11 girls end season with shutout victory

The Georgetown Girls Under-11 Mustangs scored three second half goals to close the regular season with a 3-0 victory over Mississauga B.

Holly Bigg, Jaden Todd and Natasha Green scored while Mackenzie Rees posted the shutout for the Mustangs' third straight win.

Nicole Waters had a hat-trick and Green scored twice in a 6-1 victory over Niagara Falls. Bigg had the other Mustang goal.

Green led a second-half charge as the Georgetown Mustangs scored five unanswered goals to down Oakville 7-2. Green finished with four goals while Bigg, Melissa Morgan and Amanda Knoepfli added singles.

In their previous game, the Mustangs played Burlington to a 1-1 tie. Burlington took the lead in the opening half but Melissa Morgan scored to draw Georgetown even with about 10 minutes to play.

### Boys Under-13 Mustangs

The winning goal literally had Adam Quinlan's name written all over it.

Quinlan's goal with less than a minute to play in overtime gave the van Wissen Garden Centre Mustangs a 2-1 victory over North Toronto in the championship of a tournament in Ottawa.

across the goal line to Quinlan, who put his ball into the net for the winning goal.

Andrew Hofland earned tournament MVP honours and Dirk van Soelin was named most sportsmanlike player.
