
All Canuck ideas.

We all know Alexander Graham Bell was the father of the telephone, but did you know he also co-invented the hydrofoil boat with Casey Baldwin in 1908? And the gramophone with input from Emile Berliner in 1889?

After taking a puck in the face off Andy Bathgate's stick during an NHL game in 1959, Montreal Canadiens' netminder Jacques Plante decided to come up with a device to cut down on facial stitches. The result, the goalie mask.

Speaking of hockey, author Martin Jones proves the game was invented in Dartmouth in



1860, but many wrongly say it was Montreal. And who can forget Lord Stanley's Cup?

Most people know Canada's aboriginal people created lacrosse way back when, but how many know the single base football goal post was designed by Canadian Jim Trimble in 1967?

And while we're talking about games, Trivial Pursuit was invented in 1979 by Canadians Chris Haney and Scott Abbott, while Rob Angel is the inventor of Pictionary.

The paint roller was invented by Norman Breakey of Toronto in 1940, but apparently it took Canadians a few years to accept it, and for the first few years of its life, it was more popular in the US. (Oh we are cautious Canadians.)

On a local note, just down the road in Milton, the Robertson Screw was the ingenious invention of Peter L. Robertson in 1908. And Canada Dry Ginger Ale was invented by John A. McLaughlin in 1907. 
