Forum set to discuss province's growth plan

Talton Region is hosting a public forum tomorrow (Thurs-Lday) for residents and businesses to learn about the recentlyreleased Provincial Growth Management Strategy. Halton's forum will be held in the auditorium of the Halton Regional Centre, in the north side of the building located at 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville.

A drop-in open house begins at 6 p.m., with presentations starting at 7 p.m.

In July, the Ministry of Public Infrastructure and Renewal released a paper entitled Places to Grow: A Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe that addresses the province's vision for how and where municipalities will grow. The paper also addresses the infrastructure and environmental impacts of this growth.

Halton's forum is the public's opportunity to learn about the provincial strategy. At this time, confirmation from the province regarding their attendance

is still pending.

"Public consultation has always been an important part of Halton's planning process," said Halton Regional Chairman, Joyce Savoline. "Halton is hosting the forum to receive input from the public which will assist us in developing our response to the ministry, who have given a deadline of September 24 for comments."

Regional council will consider staff's report on Halton's response to the ministry at the September 15 Planning and Public Works Committee meeting and at regional council on September 22.
