Young dancer wows judges at Nationals

Then Stephanie Wright began her dance lessons with Georgetown School of Highland Dancing at age six, instructor Sue McCarrol had no idea what was in store.

But now, at 10 years of age, Wright has wowed the Highland dance circles, with her outstanding accomplishments in competitive dance, which includes winning numerous Canadian championships across Canada.

As a beginner, Wright showed what she was made of when she took the hat-trick at her first major competition in Ancaster, June 2002. She won three trophies, including the Best Overall, Most Promising Dancer and the Beginner Class Trophy, all in the same competition.

She went on to compete in the Canadians in Vancouver, B.C. that summer and came home with six medals, narrowly missing winning the class trophy.

McCarrol decided to fast-track her in the spring 2003, and moved her up to Novice level. Wright competed at the Canadians again, this time in St. Catharines, coming home with both the National and Highland trophies in the Novice division.

Steadily advancing through the divisions, she moved up to

Intermediate, during which time she captured nine trophies, and 22 medals.

This year in April, McCarrol once gain moved her up a division, placing her into the Premier class.

"I wanted her to compete at the Niagara Championship competition as a Premier," said McCarrol. "By dancing at that level, I wanted to pre-

pare her for the Canadians."

In the meantime, leading up to the Canadians in Winnipeg, Wright continued her sweep of the competitions, winning the second runner-up trophy with a gold and two silvers at the Western Championships in London, as well as the Eastern Ontario Championships in Scar-borough, when she won the fourth runner-up trophy.

Going on to the Ontario Provincial Championships at Harbourfront, she came home with the third runner-up trophy, which primed for her competition at the Canadians in

Winnipeg in early July.

The competition was divided into three days, and Wright rose to the challenge. The first day, she won a bronze, fifth and sixth in the Highland competition, and returned the next day to capture the trophy in the Nationals, as well as a gold, a silver and a fourth place.

The final day, she danced in the prechampionship competition, wowing everyone with a trophy, three gold medals and a fourth. That same day, she wanted to attempt dancing in the North American Championships, and managed to win a sixth, in spite of the fact it was her first time competing at that level

where the steps are longer and the
criteria even more challenging.

"I was so proud of Stephanie at the Canadians," said McCarrol, "It was her first time at that level as a Premier dancer and she did so well."

"She is very mature for her age, and has shown she can handle the process in moving up through the See WORLD, pg. 7
