## Dog poop leads to assault charge

dispute over dog excrement led to a Georgetown woman being L charged with assault Saturday.

The victim was visiting a friend on Academy Road in Georgetown when her child stepped in dog excrement in the back yard. The victim believed the excrement was left by a dog belonging to a neighbour, who shares an unfenced back yard. Later, after the victim saw the dog defecating on the lawn, the victim and the accused got into a verbal altercation.

Halton Police say the accused then punched the victim in the eye and hit her several times, bruising her arms, legs and back.
