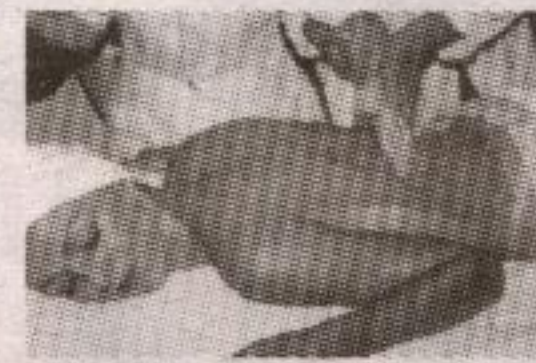

## Police blotter Dog poop leads to assault charge

A dispute over dog excrement led to a Georgetown woman being charged with assault Saturday.

The victim was visiting a friend on Academy Road in Georgetown when her child stepped in dog excrement in the back yard. The victim believed the excrement was left by a dog belonging to a neighbour, who shares an unfenced back yard. Later, after the victim saw the dog defecating on the lawn, the victim and the accused got into a verbal altercation.

Halton Police say the accused then punched the victim in the eye and hit her several times, bruising her arms, legs and back.

Charged with assault is Heather Deforest, 25, of Academy Road in Georgetown. She is to appear in court in Burlington on October 12.

A 60-year-old Dufferin Aggregates employee was airlifted to hospital after falling approximately 60 feet at the Dublin Line quarry Monday.

The man, whose name is not being released, was performing routine maintenance on a conveyor belt. It is believed he caught his arm and fell around 12:30 p.m.

He was taken to Hamilton General Hospital by air ambulance with non-life-threatening injuries.

Some time between 6:30 p.m. last Monday and 8:30 a.m. last Tuesday, three hubcaps were stolen from a Grand Prix parked at a John St., Acton residence. The hubcaps are valued at \$200.

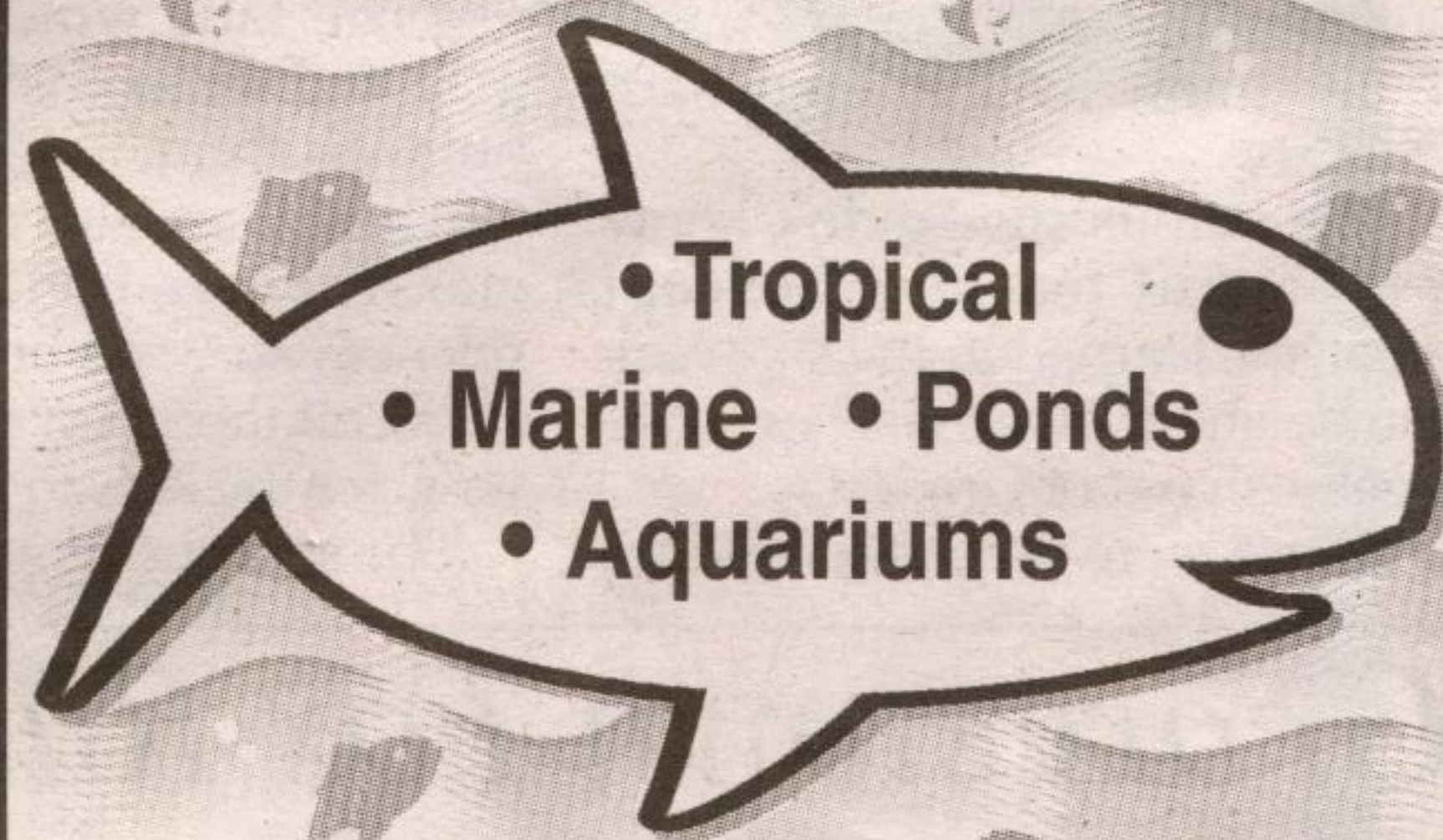
