terrain flat and the prevailing winds were from west to east. Halton will be a challenge with the hills (and changing winds). It'll definitely be a lot tougher," he said.

While the Halton tour was supposed to be a solo effort, Bruce said a member of the Crime Stoppers board of directors has shown an interest in joining him. James Spalding, a producer with Cogeco cable TV, may ride with him for part or all of the 300 km.

As for funding, Bruce indicated it has been like Halton Hills' terrain at times—a slow, uphill climb.

"To this point we have no corporate sponsorship. Some pledges from smaller businesses are in the works. We gave ourselves a goal of raising \$3,000-\$5,000."

Bruce's tentative itinerary for the RACE event is:


Day 1 (Sept. 24)— Cycling begins from Ares Restaurant in Georgetown. Tickets will be available for guests to have breakfast and show support for the event. Tickets are \$10 per person and includes breakfast, door prizes and draws. For tickets call 905-878-5511 ext. 5139 or 905-873-0538. Bruce will cycle through many areas of Halton Hills and into Milton.

Day 2 (Sept. 25)— Will pick up somewhere in Milton and likely move into Oakville. Bruce will arrive at police headquarters around noon. Between 10 a.m.-2 p.m. the Halton Children's Safety Village will be opened and, in keeping with the cycling theme, the public will be invited to bring their children to go through the bicycle safety program. Parents of children ages 7-9 can have their youngsters learn bicycle safety by booking a session time (905-878-5511 ext. 5139 or 905-825-4747 ext. 5139). A barbecue will also be held.

Day 3 (Sept. 26)— Will take Bruce through Burlington. A finale will be held at Paradiso Restaurant. Tickets at \$55 each will be sold for a lobster dinner to be held at the restaurant.
