Fernbrook Homes wishes to locate a Sewage Pump Station on Town owned lands located in Georgetown South in order to accommodate servicing requirements for the development of the Georgetown South area between Mountainview Road and the Eighth Line (Main Street), north of Regional Road 10 (Ten Side Road). To facilitate this connection, Fernbrook Homes has approached the Town with a request to locate a Regional Sewage Pump Station on Town-owned open space land.

The proposed pump station will be owned and operated by the Region of Halton and will accommodate needs for both residential development planned for the area, the Gellert Community Centre and a future Public Secondary School site. There are no environmental constraints on this area of the Town open space system.

This Public Information Centre will provide you with an opportunity to review the project drawings and to discuss the proposed works with representatives from the Regional Municipality of Halton, Sernas Associates, the Project Consulting Engineer and the Town of Halton Hills.



#### **CLEANING YOUR DENTURES**

# Town steps up marketing plan for 401-407 Gateway Business Park

The Town of Halton Hills has stepped up its marketing efforts for the 401-

407 Gateway.

The business park (or at least a portion of it) is ready to go—servicing is in and the pumping station to make it operational should be done in November, the lands are zoned, development charges have been finalized, and major industrial developers have purchased some of the lands in the corridor.

"We have aggressively put all the pieces in place to make the 401-407 Gateway Business Park an attractive place for industry to

locate," said Halton Hills Mayor Rick early 2006.
Bonnette. "Now we are going to market it lessaid acquired acquired"

"We want businesses to come here and believe me with what we have to offer, it will. We have the location and we have the right attitude," said Bonnette.

The Town's marketing campaign for the corridor will include a direct mail campaign to real estate professionals in the GTA, developers and design/build companies, as well as one-on-one calls to high profile real estate professionals and development company executives.

The Town also plans to advertise in economic development publications, host information seminars for real estate professionals and send information packages to the media.

The business park located between Steeles Ave. (south side) and Hwy. 401 from

James Snow Parkway through Winston Churchill Blvd., encompasses approximately 1,000 acres.

The Town's economic development offi-

cer Allan O'Neill said there are approximately 300 acres in the first phase— from James Snow Parkway to Fifth Line South— to be serviced by November.

O'Neill said negotiations are ongoing between the Town and other landowners including Mold-Masters to extend the servicing to Trafalgar Rd., approximately an additional 350 acres.

"It seems the discussions are very positive," said O'Neill.

If all goes well, O'Neill said servicing could be to Trafalgar Rd. by

He said First Gulf Developments has acquired approximately 40 acres on the north side of Steeles Ave. west of Fifth Line, and Hopewell Developments has purchased approximately 62 acres on the south side of Steeles Ave. west of Sixth Line with exposure on Hwy. 401. Mold-Masters owns a large parcel of land on the west side of Trafalgar Rd. with exposure on the 401.

O'Neill said, "the level of inquiry (about the gateway) is really, really high."

"For the first time since I've been in the position we actually have one of the best products in the marketplace," said O'Neill.
