## Stewarttown claims five titles at Optimist cross-country meet

Georgetown Christian School narrowly prevented a Stewarttown sweep at the Optimist Club of Georgetown Cross-Country Meet.

The Stewarttown Stingers won five of the six divisions it competed in, with Georgetown Christian School narrowly holding off the Stingers by a single point to claim the 13-year-old girls division.

Georgetown Christian also won the nine-year-old girls division while the other five divisions were split with Park, Joseph Gibbons, Harrison, Silver Creek and Limehouse each winning one.

Cameron Shortt led a Stewarttown sweep in the 13-year-old boys division. He was followed by teammates John Currie in second and John Cameron in third.

In the 13-year-old girls division it was Georgetown Christian's Emily West taking first followed by Stewarttown's Baillie Marshall in second and Chelsea Jensen in third.

Luke Laidlaw of Georgetown Christian School won the 12-year-old boys race. St. Brigid's Ashton Waters was second and Stewarttown's Liam Robertson was third.

Tara Bishop of Stewarttown took first place in the 12-year-old girls race. Teammate Vicky Strachen was second while there was a tie for third between Centennial's Kara Woolley and Stewarttown's Katie Darling.

The two 11-year-old races were both Stewarttown sweeps. Ben Jolly won the boys race with Michael Shortt second and Raymond Kimbur third.

Alexander Jarvis won the girls race with Holly Bigg finishing second and Emilie Driedger taking third.

It was almost a one-two brother finish in the 10-year-old boys race. Michael Nicolucci of St. Brigid's was the winner while Bryson Nicolucci was third. Breaking up the brothers was Alex Freer of George Kennedy, who finished second. Limehouse won the division.

Kristen Childs won and Carolyn Hale finished second to help Joseph Gibbons win the 10-year-old girls division. Sarah Racinsky of Limehouse was third.

Josh Sterk of St. Brigid was first in the nine-year-old boys race. Alex Robertson of Limehouse was second and Matthew Stoddart of Harrison was third but it was Silver Creek that claimed the team title.

Limehouse's Abigail Jolly took first place in the nine-year-old girls race. Clare Dickson of Harrison was second and Georgetown Christian School's Lisa Laidlaw was third.

Silver Creek's Blair Vanderglas won the eight-year-old boys race but it was the finishes of Kurt Hughs (second) and Mitchell Krafczek (third) that helped Harrison win the team title.

Kirsten Hack of Joseph Gibbons was first across the line in the eight-year-old girls race. She was followed by George Kennedy's Hayley Buist in second and Park's Ryan Keen in third. Park claimed the team championship.

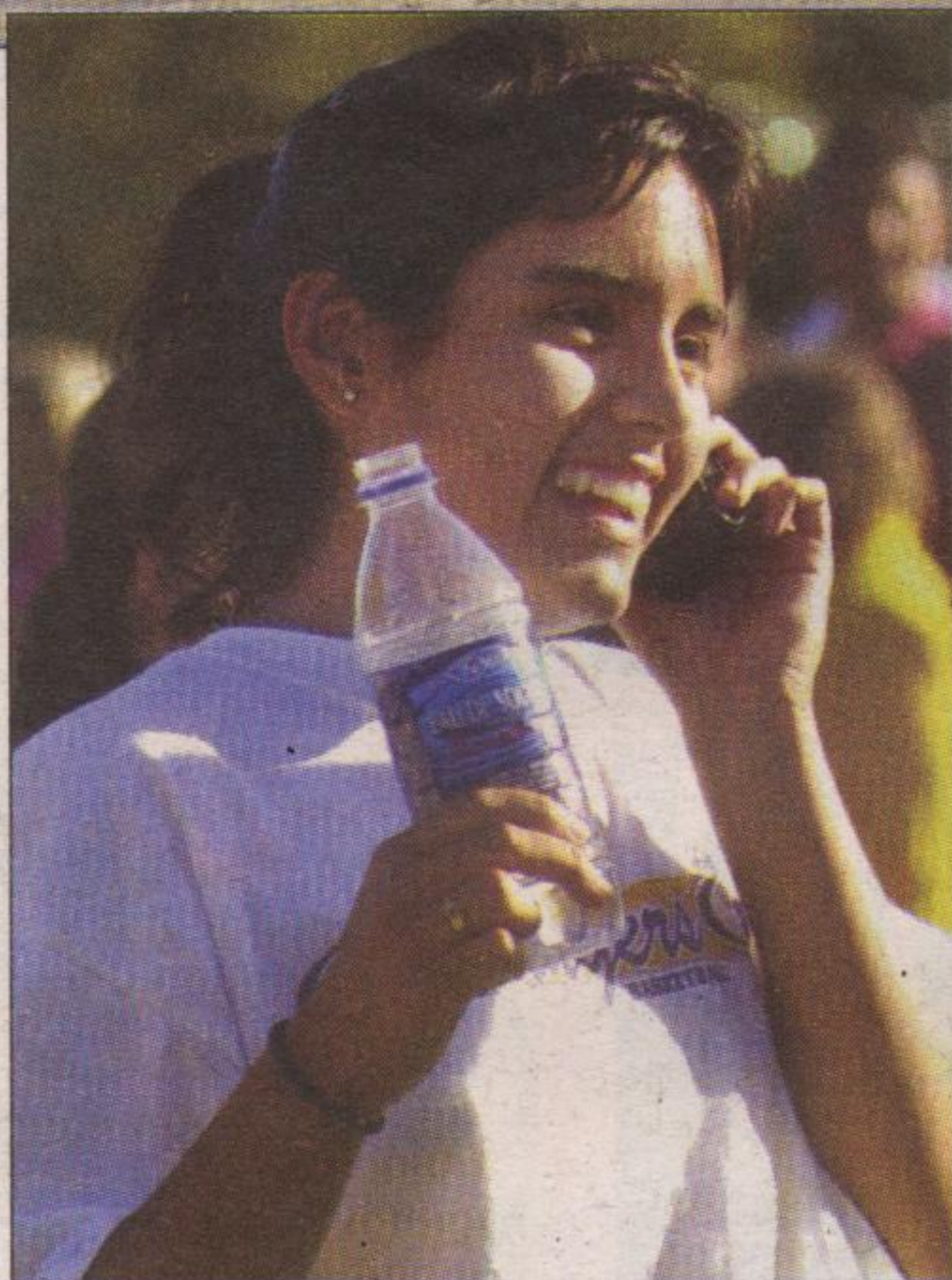
