Junior football


John Leckie ran for six touchdowns and more than 200 yards to lead the Georgetown Rebels to a 52-0 win over Christ the King in the Halton season opener.



After tying their opening game, Halton won five straight, including a 4-3 semifinal victory over the hosts when Michael Nicolucci scored in triple overtime.




