Catholic school kids to take a walk today

Students from four Halton Catholic District School Board elementary schools in Halton Hills will join millions of children from around the world today (Wednesday) in the International Walk to School Day (IWALK), as part of International Walk to School Week (October 4-8).

IWALK is an annual event designed to motivate children and parents to adopt an active mode of transportation to and from school. The focus of IWALK is on the benefits of walking rather than being driven to school.

More than 1,000 schools from across the province are expected to participate in this year's event. Local participating schools this year include St. Brigid, St. Catherine and St. Francis of Assissi in Georgetown and Acton's St. Joseph.

Last year's Ontario IWALK event involved 330,000 students from 850 schools and avoided the release of 13 tonnes of carbon dioxide.

Halton Police arrest four in marijuana bust

Four area residents are facing charges after Halton Police found \$18,000 worth of dried marijuana in a 22 Sideroad home Tuesday evening.

Police were at the home to arrest James Tyson Merten, 21 on outstanding warrants for failing to appear in court in June on a theft under \$5,000 charge in connection with the theft of a video game from Zellers in May.

While there, officers saw a large quantity of dried marijuana and a cannabis resin extraction lab in the home.

Halton Regional Police Service's Drug and Morality Bureau officers were called and seized 2.9 kg of dried marijuana as well as ar extraction lab setup, cannabis resin, a scale debt list, packaging, cash and cell phones.

Charged with possession for the purpose of trafficking and produce controlled substance is James Tyson Merten, 21, of 22 Sideroad Jason Thomas Gadoutsis, 23, of Confederation St., Paul David Jorgensen, 22, of Stewar MacLaren Rd, and Helen Ann Roussos, 22, of Evans Place.
