

Mural adorns Wesleyan St. building

In keeping with its mandate of seeking to enhance the beauty and vitality of the Adowntown core through art, ArtWorks Georgetown has given the community another mural on the south-facing wall of 4 Wesleyan St. at the corner of Main St. S.

The small volunteer group was also responsible for the mural at the corner of Mill St. at the corner of Guelph St, painted in 2000, as well as the metal artwork and signs decorating several alleyways off Main St.: Silver Lane, Hardware Alley, Bowling Lane, Lawson Lane, Herald Route and Short Circuit, created in 2002.

The new mural is 250 sq. ft. and depicts the Niagara Escarpment, the Bruce Trail, and the Limehouse kilns. It was painted by illustrator,


Robert Johannsen this summer, over a period of 30 days, as weather permitted.

"People may not notice all these things right away, but after they spend some time downtown, they do see them, and that makes it a nice place to be," says Marcia Dye, owner of Foodstuffs.

ArtWorks arranged the fund-raising and managed all these projects. Currently on the ArtWorks team is Sandy Mackenzie, retired Georgetown businessman, Elizabeth Grin of Sunshine Design and Dye.

"It's a lot of work, but when it's done, and you see how beautiful the art is, it's all worth it," says Grin.
