Helmets are mandatory for cyclists

Treceived an e-mail from a woman who is concerned for her neighbours' chil-Ldren because they don't wear their bicycle helmets.

I also had a phone call from a teacher who says that many of her students don't wear their helmets either. I would like to know why children still aren't wearing their helmets. I would also like to know why parents aren't insisting that their children wear helmets.

There is legislation in place that makes wearing a helmet mandatory. Section 104(2.1) of the HTA says "No person shall ride on or operate a bicycle on a highway unless the person is wearing a helmet that complies with the regulations and the chin strap of the helmet is securely fastened under the chin." Subsection (2.2) goes on to say that "No parent of or guardian of a person under 16 yrs of age shall authorize or knowingly permit that person to ride on or operate a bicycle on a highway unless the person is wearing a bicycle helmet as required by subsection (2.1)."

There is no doubt that helmets save lives, the same way that seat-belts and child safety seats do. I find it hard to believe that parents don't care. Young people often have the "won't happen to me" attitude, but parents need to realize that it does happen to someone.

I have been to accident scenes where cyclists have been injured. I have delivered death notifications to family members. I don't like it. No officer does. I would much rather take a child home with skinned knees.

I urge, no, challenge, parents to have their children wear helmets, and to wear helmets themselves. Children will follow a good example. Speak to neighbours if their children aren't wearing helmets.
