

Finishes fifth in final race Penfold top rookie in Michelin Series

A lex Penfold captured the 2004 Honda Michelin Challenge Series Rookie Championship with a solid fifth-place finish this past weekend at Mosport, in an action-packed race that saw him get "removed" from second place with three laps to go.

Penfold, of Georgetown, also finished in sixth place overall in the overall championship.

Penfold set the fastest time in the morning warm-up and was feeling good despite his sixth-place grid position. The start was clean and Penfold maintained his position on lap one but lap two saw him drop to seventh place. He moved back to sixth the following lap and then settled in with the lead group.

The top six ran nose-to-tail for most of the race, with a few position and driver changes. Penfold maintained his contact with the leaders and set the fastest lap of the race, in the process. Then with three laps to go, everyone came through turn one side by side and Penfold came out in second place.


"I thought, 'Great, second place is good'.
Then I looked in my mirror, felt a few bumps from behind and coming out of the next corner I was back to fifth place," he said.

"But hey, I won the rookie championship for Pfaff Leasing and Lakeshore Honda, and that was far more important."

Saturday's practice was wet and cool and Penfold set the third-fastest time on the very tricky Mosport track in Bowmanville.

"It was really slick out there" he said.

After a major rainstorm at lunch, the teams headed to the track for qualifying and Penfold




Alex Penfold celebrates his win as the Michelin Series top rookie driver of 2004.

chose to run the dry Michelin Pilot Sport tires, as they proved to be better in the rain at Trois Rivieres a month ago.

"I have only run the rain once at Mosport and we used the rain spec tires that time, so I thought I would take it easy and make sure I made the race." he said. Penfold set the sixth-fastest time in qualifying.

"It was a great season. I had a lot of fun and I learned a lot about racing and about myself. Thanks to everyone who helped, especially all my sponsors— Pfaff Leasing, Pfaff Autoworks, Lakeshore Honda, CSN and Active Mountain Raceway."
