The Hostages release first CD next Friday

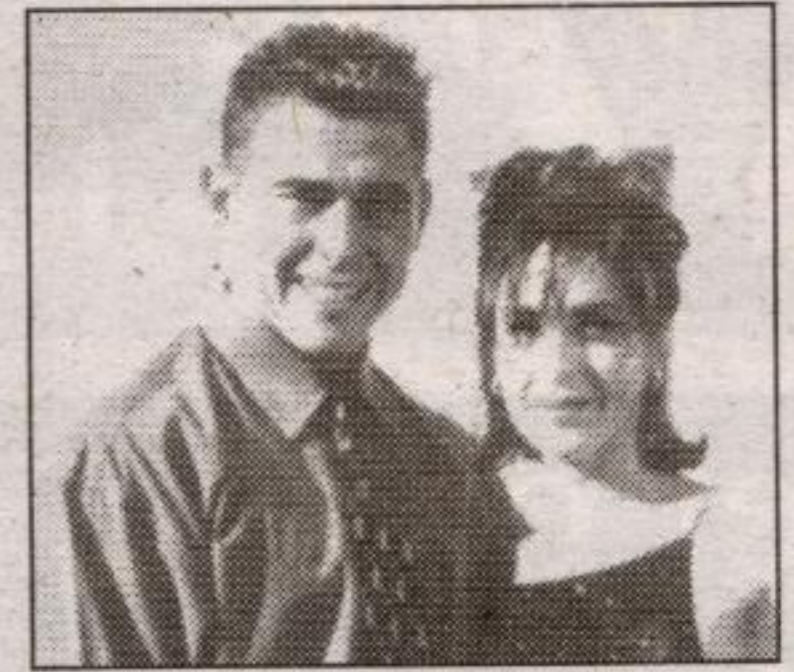
Fashion show

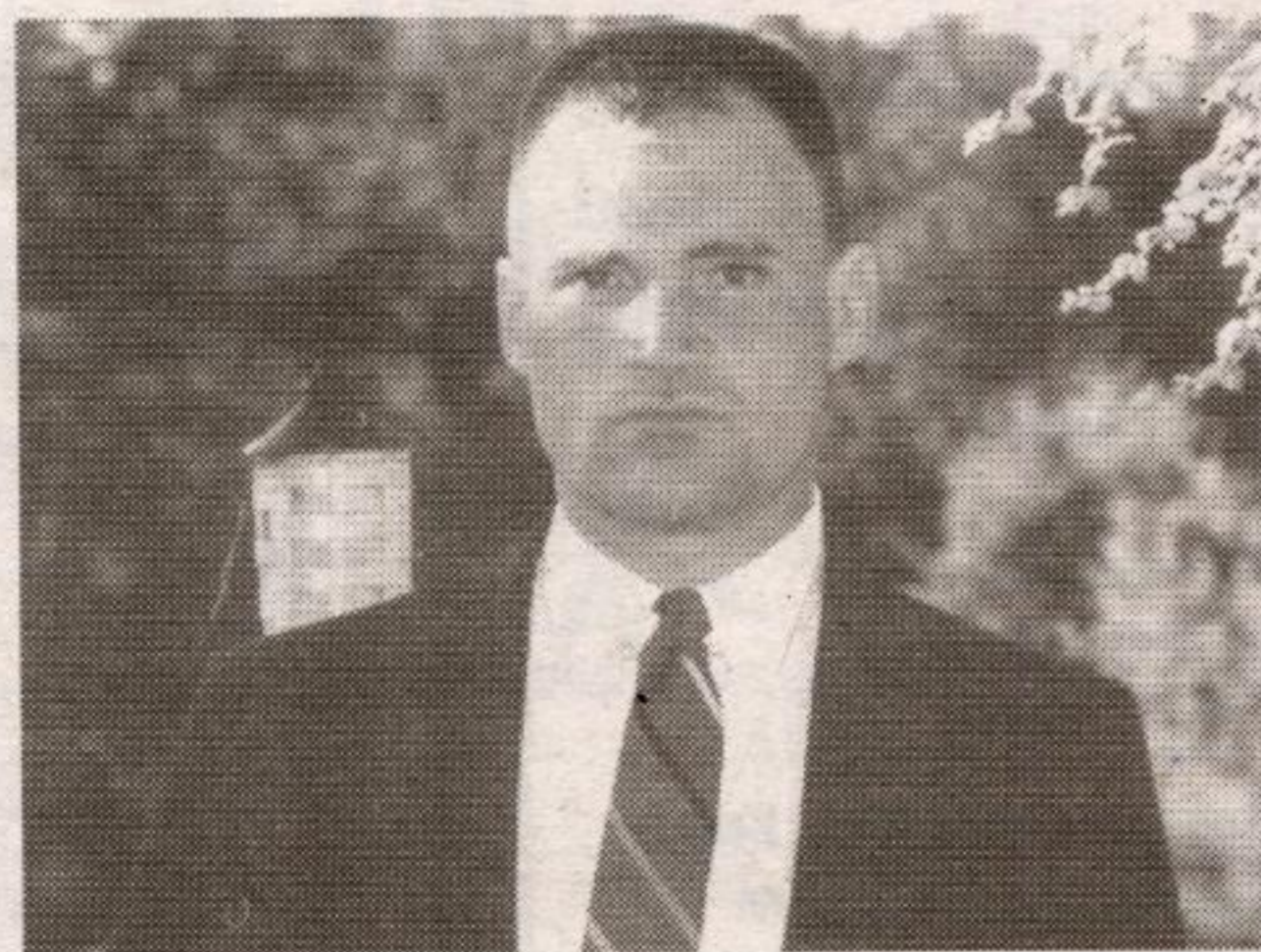

Guide to the Outdoors

Last week I talked about the importance of keeping your water bottles clean. Here are some suggestions for cleaning your NALGENE bottles and containers. Soak in soapy water or soak in warm water with lemon or baking soda. Both the Lexan (PC) and the LDPE bike bottles can be cleaned in the dishwasher. Make sure they are on the top rack and away from the heating element. If you like the wide mouth Nalgene's but you're like me and you spill more than you drink, we now have splash guards in stock. The splash guard fits in to the bottles mouth and it can go in to the dishwasher as well. Happy splash-free drinking!
