
Raiders enjoy championship feast at Thanksgiving tourney

Georgetown won five of the eight division titles in the inaugural tournament. The victories included the expected— the Minor Atom AE Raiders outscored their opponents 32-2 before doubling Flamborough 4-2 in the final— and the unexpected— the Toppers Pizza Major Peewee AE Raiders avenged an earlier 5-1 loss to Oakville by posting a 4-0 shutout in the final.

The Major Atom Raiders posted four wins and a tie on their way to the title, the Minor Atom Raiders allowed only two goals to win their third tournament of the season and the Major Novice Raiders won three straight one-goal decisions to claim the championship.

But the only victory wasn't on the ice. Although most of the hardware stayed in town, the tournament drew positive reviews from the visiting teams.

Minor Atom


