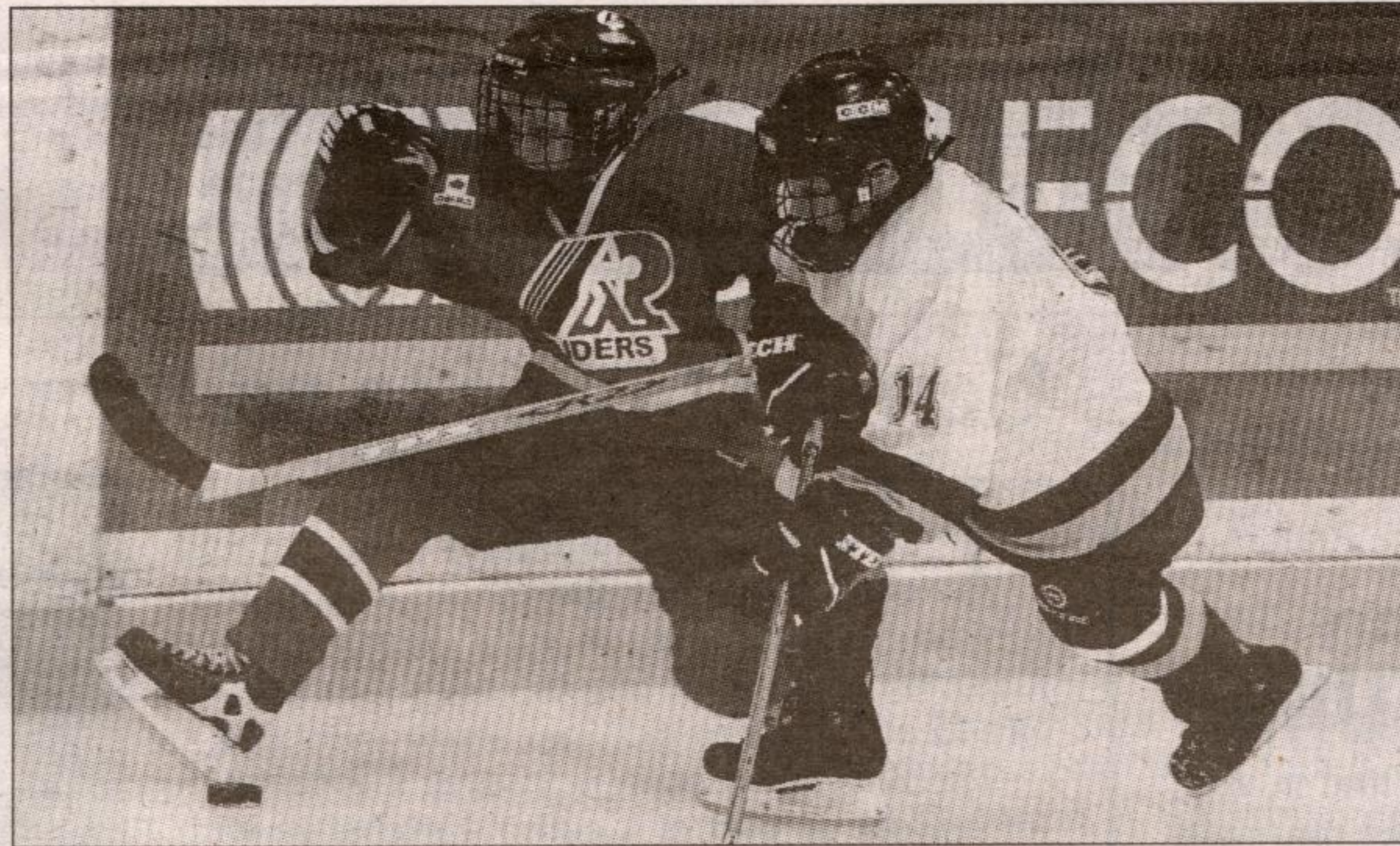
Tonowanda got an overtime goal from Adam Dikeman to edge Mississauga 2-1 in the championship game.
