Firefighters grilling to benefit Habitat for Humanity

Burlington Professional Firefighters Association members will be cooking up a storm in their 4th annual barbecue at Joe Dog's Gas Bar Grill on Monday, October 18 from 11:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Proceeds this year will go to Habitat for Humanity Halton, a not-for-profit group that builds homes for working families below the poverty line who need a "hand up, not a hand out."

Habitat Halton is currently building a home in Acton and has also purchased land in Georgetown. Habitat has already built two houses in Burlington and is searching for land in Milton and Oakville.

Tickets are only \$8.00 and may be purchased at Joe Dog's, 533 Brant Street in Burlington. The menu will feature all-you-

can-eat hot dogs, hamburgers, chicken on a bun and salad. Joe Dog's kitchen will be shut down for the day, and the Burlington Professional Firefighters will be in charge of the barbecuing to raise money for Habitat.

The last three years' events that the Burlington Professional Firefighters hosted at Joe Dog's raised a total of over \$ 10,000.

The community can further support Habitat's mission by calling Habitat for salvage opportunities of kitchens, windows and doors that may be sold through the ReStore. Tax receipts will be issued for the fair market value of the items when sold. Volunteers are needed to work in the ReStore, open Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and until 4:00 p.m. on Saturday.
