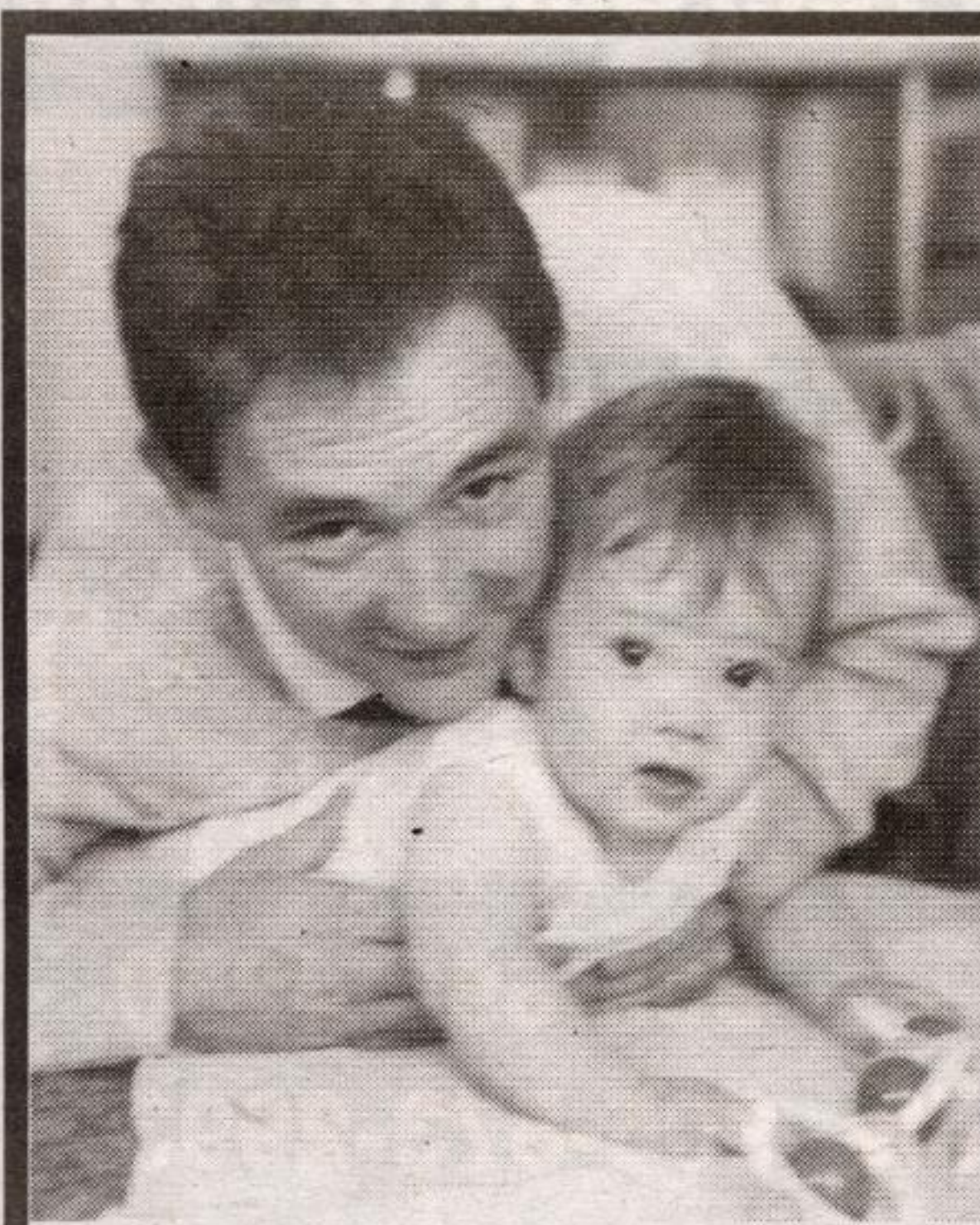
Halton Region event to build 'Bridge to Better Business'

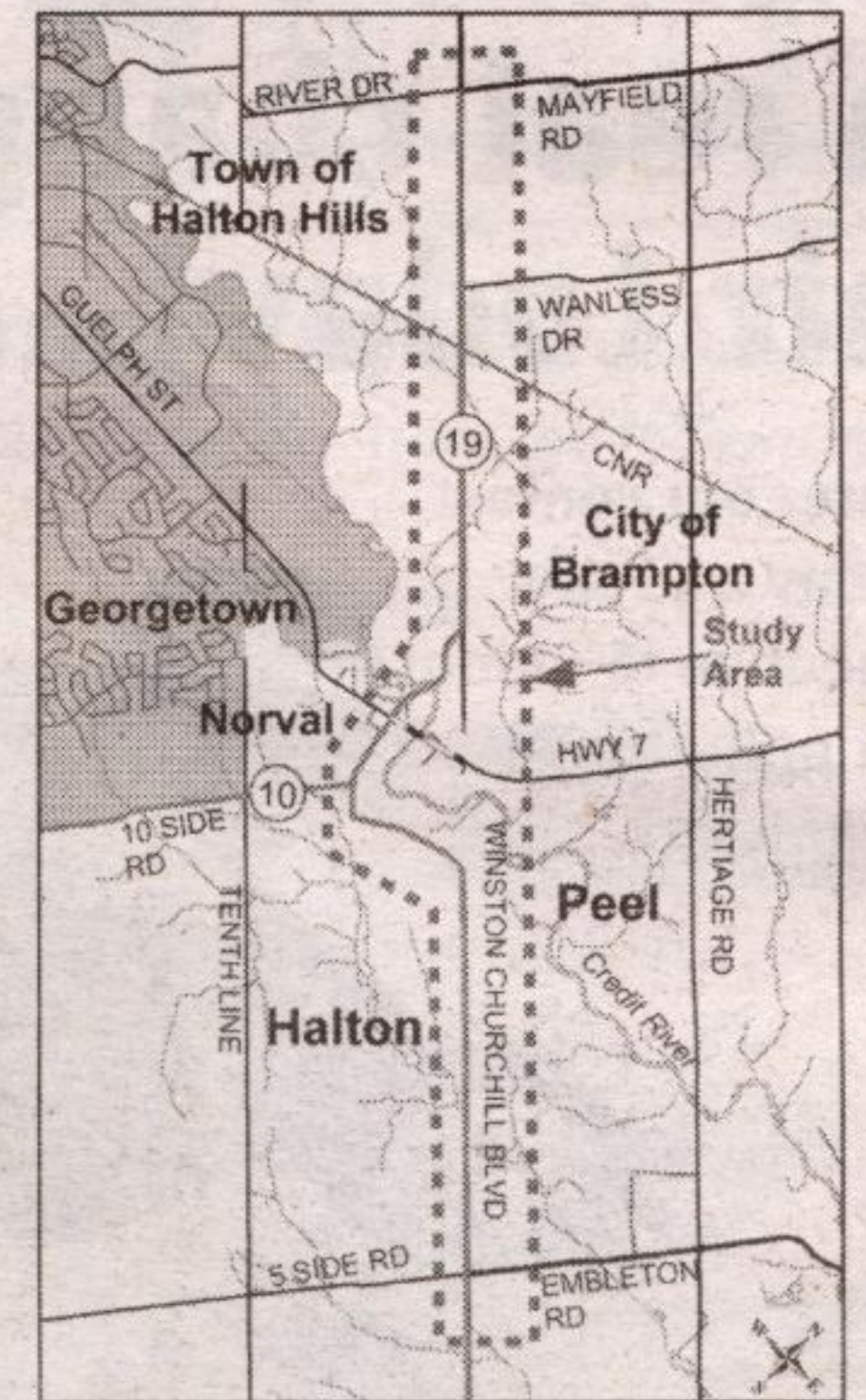

Notice of Public Information Centre #2 Winston Churchill Boulevard (Regional Road 19) between Embleton Road/5 Side Road and Mayfield Road/River Drive Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Study

The Regional Municipality of Peel, in association with the Regional Municipality of Halton and the Town of Halton Hills, is undertaking to examine options for the rehabilitation of Winston Churchill Boulevard (Regional Road 19) between Embleton Road/5 Side Road and Mayfield Road/River Drive (refer to Key Plan below). Winston Churchill Boulevard is a boundary road separating the Region of Peel and the Region of Halton with shared jurisdiction between the Regions of Peel and Halton. SNC-Lavalin Engineers & Constructors (SLE&C) has been retained by the Regions to assist with this initiative. A number of factors have led to the commencement of this study, including potential capacity deficiencies (existing and future); structural condition of the road; road safety issues; and approved and proposed changes in land uses.

The study is being conducted in accordance with the Municipal Engineers Association's Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (June 2000) as a Schedule "C" undertaking. As part of the environmental assessment process, the Project Team is providing opportunities for affected and interested parties to provide input to the planning and design investigations. A Notice of Study Commencement inviting initial input was published in September 2003, a Community Workshop was held on October 27th, 2003, and Public Information Centre #1 was held on February 12, 2004. To further facilitate input, Public Information Centre (PIC) #2 will be held, as follows:

The purpose of the PIC is to provide information on the Project Team's alternative design concepts, address pavement deficiencies, traffic operational problems, and opportunities for improvements in the Winston Churchill Boulevard corridor. The Regions of Halton and Peel, and consultant engineering staff will be available at the PIC to receive comments and explain the information displayed.
