Hilton Falls unveils new waterfall exhibit

Conservation Halton recently opened a new exhibit at the visitors centre at the Hilton Falls Conservation Area. The new exhibit features the park's most significant landform - a 10 metre waterfall that cascades over the escarpment amidst lush woodlands.

A series of illustrated panels show how Hilton Falls was formed and details the pioneer sawmills that were constructed nearby. The exhibit includes information on the water control reservoir and the wide range of plants and animals inhabiting the park.

Hilton Falls is a 645 hectare park located on the Niagara Escarpment in Milton that has more than 20 km of hiking, biking and cross country skiing trails. The area is a regional environmentally sensitive area and recognized as one of the largest natural areas in southern Ontario.
