## Residents voice concerns about renovation of Barber Mill

Tore than 100 people packed the public gallery of the Halton Hill Civic Centre council chambers Monday night to hear details about the proposed redevelopment of the Barber Mill property in Georgetown.

The proposal includes a 14-storey condominium, four-storey hotel, and a commercial area that could include restaurant, art gallery, museum or even a private school.

Residents had concerns about:

blocked views

 over-development and inappropriate development of the site

- increased noise, traffic and lights
- deterioration of local roads and nearby bridge
- lack of parking
- questionable preservation of the historical site
- · impact on the wildlife and environmentally sensitive areas
  - lowered property values
  - lack of notification
  - height of the apartment
  - flooding and impact on the Credit River

contrary to the Town's Strategic Plan.

Finally, Save Our Ravines president Bert Zonneveld concluded the meeting by vowing to fight this "monstrosity" ... "with all the resources that we used in the past in the fight against the development in the Hungry Hollow."






