

Youth, 22-year-old face charges after officers pull over stolen car

Two young men are facing charges after Halton Police stopped a stolen vehicle on Langstone Cr. Tuesday afternoon.

At approximately 2:45 p.m. police saw two males getting into a 1997 Subaru Legacy that had been stolen in Georgetown Monday night.

Police pulled over the car and the two men fled on foot. The car was left in drive and collided with a police cruiser, but caused no damage.

After a brief foot chase police arrested

the driver of the car, but the passenger got away. Police identified the passenger and arrested him on Wednesday.

A 17-year-old youth was charged with theft over \$5,000, five counts of use a stolen credit card, breach of recognizance, dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, and eight counts of failing to comply with Youth Criminal Justice Act probation.

Also charged was Christopher Moss, 22, of Daniel St., Erin, with being an occupant in a motor vehicle taken without the owner's consent, and breach of probation.

Halton Regional Police officers are investigating several break-ins that occurred in Georgetown Tuesday.

Jewelry and cash were taken from each home and police believe the break and enters may have been related.

A Churchill Cr. home was entered sometime between 8:15 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. and a Danridge Cr. home was broken into between 10:15 and 11 a.m.

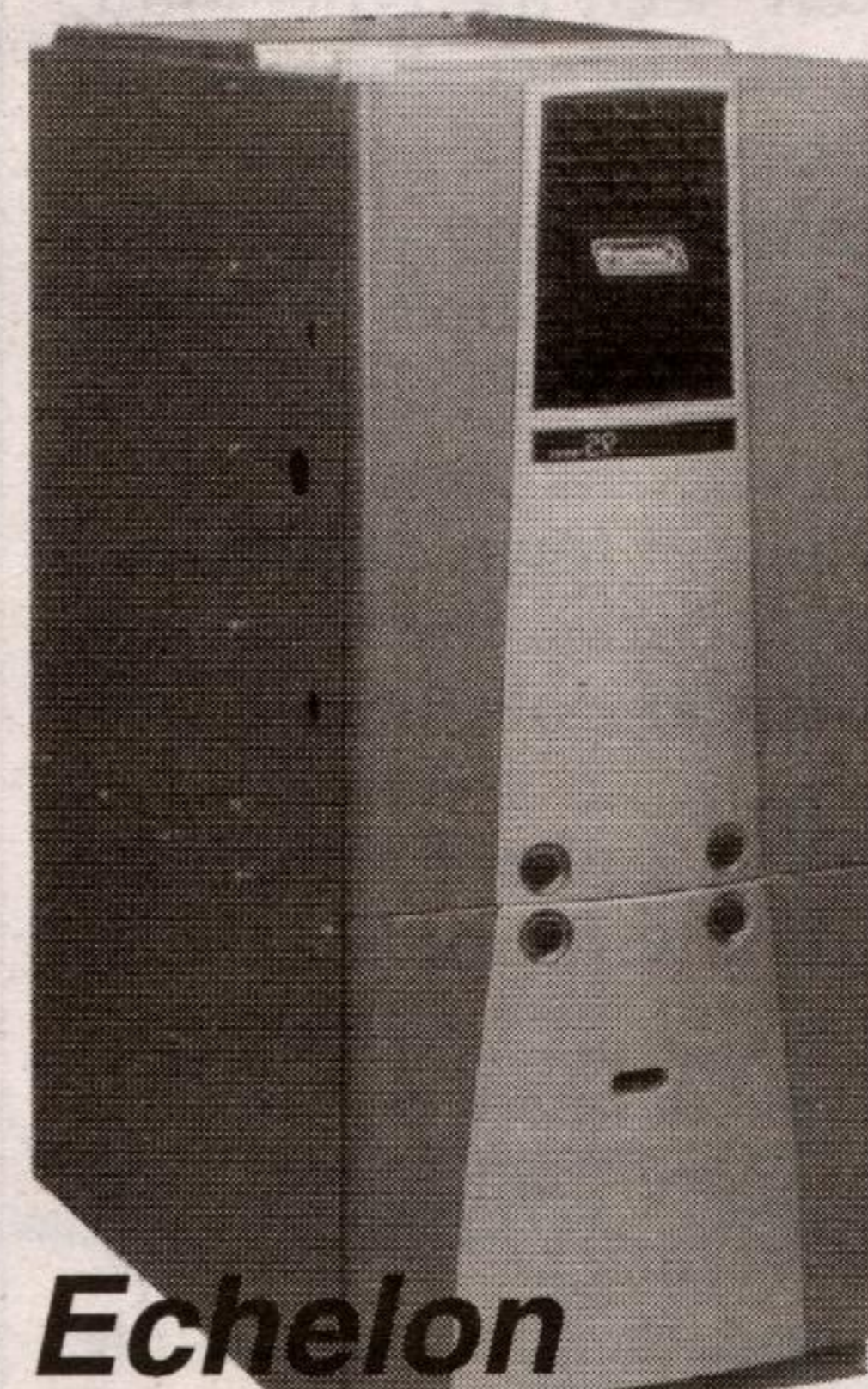
Entry was gained into the Danridge Cr. home through the garage.

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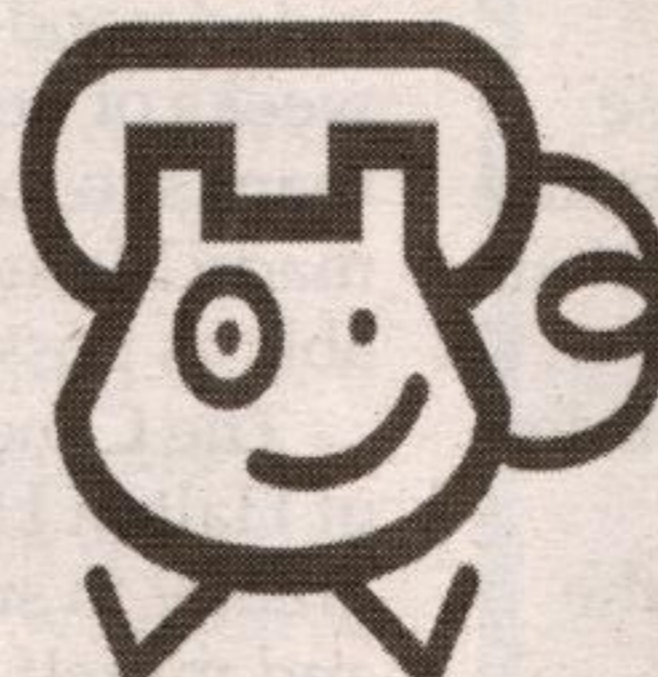


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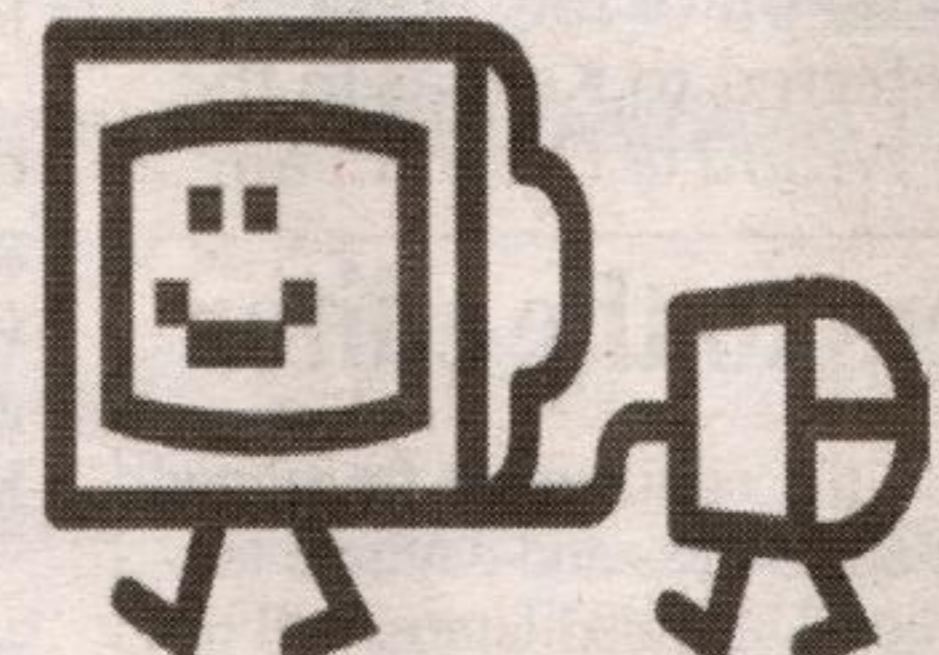
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Don't throw your PIN in the Bin!

If you have registered for Recreation Programs with the Town of Halton Hills since January 1st 2003, we'll be sending you a PIN# this month so that you will be able to use the new online and telephone registration systems. You'll receive a letter from us along with a card for you to record your Family PIN # and the Personal Identification #'s for family members. Watch for it in the mail and don't throw it out!

If you have not registered for Town programs since January 1st of 2003, you will need to apply for your PIN#. Forms are available at all Town facilities, online at www.haltonhills.ca or in the Town's Fall and Winter Activity Guide delivered to all residences in August. You must have a PIN# and a valid VISA or MasterCard to use the system.

Phase I of the new system will go live at 8 AM on December 1st and will only be available to registrants of Winter 2005 Aquatic Learn-to-Swim Programs and Advanced Lifesaving Programs.

Registration for all Winter 2005 non-aquatic programs will continue to use the existing processes of drop-off, mail-in or by FAX 905-873-1587. The lottery date for these programs is December 1, 2004.

Phase II will be launched in the Spring of 2005 and will permit online and telephone registration for most Aquatic and Community Programs. At this time the lottery system will be discontinued. More information will be provided in the Spring & Summer 2005 brochure to be released February 2005.



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
