





Lung Association launches website

Your home's bad air quality could be history with these tips

Take a quick look around your home and you too will realize that truth can be more scary than fiction, so says The Lung Association in its fall launch of www.YourHealthyHome.ca, which helps consumers fight off hidden enemies and keep their indoor air healthy.

Leading a tour through an east Toronto home, Brian Stocks, Air Quality manager for The Lung Association a.k.a., Healthy Homes, unveiled some of the dastardly culprits that rob families of optimal health.

Today, chemicals are one of the prime offenders, often stored under the kitchen or bathroom sink. As well, vapours from some types of carpeting, window coverings and other furnishings, are emitted throughout your home, often trapped inside because today's home is airtight.

"Homes now are becoming more energy-efficient, which means air is sealed inside for greater warmth in the winter and cooling during the summer months," says Stocks. "But it also means airborne contaminants can remain trapped inside as well, and that can have a damaging effect on your family's health. What you don't look for can really hurt you."

The Lung Association's new website, www.YourHealthyHome.ca does the sleuth work for consumers, pointing out common problem areas and offering elementary solutions.

Consumers wanting to dig out their magnifying glass can conduct their own surveillance on the air quality enemy. Beware— dangerous elements include:

• Where there is steam and humidity, there is the potential for mould so be sure to run fans in the kitchen and bathrooms when needed.

• That lovely aroma of a fire burning is deceiving. If you can smell your fire, that means there are carcinogens and other compounds in the air.

 Most family pets have dander, which can trigger asthma and act as an irritant for many individuals.

 Microscopic animals, such as the dust mite, feed off human skin and hair. They can be eliminated by washing pillows, bedding and stuffed animals at high temperatures.

• Your furnace acts like the lungs in your home. Use of a high efficiency pleated filter can help remove many of the smaller particles from the air.

• Check your basement for mould. The bacteria from mould can travel throughout your home. Look for cracks in your foundation— these can allow seepage of moisture and radon into your home.

• Provide a place outdoors for guests who choose to smoke. Tobacco smoke is one of the leading triggers for asthma.

• Use a central vacuum system to remove dust to a sealed canister outside of the living area.

The Lung Association's Healthy Home program assists consumers interested in keeping their home healthy, particularly those who may have a family member suffering from asthma or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease. The new website offers an on-line home tour, among other features, designed to heighten awareness of the indoor air quality problem and ways to alleviate it.

"The majority of people assume our air problem is largely outdoors," says Stocks. "But we spend up to 90 percent of our time indoors and can make major improvements to our home environment applying relatively simple remedies."
