## Smitherman gets hero's welcome but says town must continue to grow

"Not every hospital is going to provide the complete range of services," he said.

When asked about the future of the obstetrics program in Georgetown he said the base of obstetrics numbers at the hospital are "pretty good."

"I think the community needs to continue to grow," he added. "It needs to be a community where people are building their families and if we do that then the obstetrics program can be very, very secure."

He added, "we need to make sure the program is of a good quality. "


While the province has made the first step in keeping the obstetrics unit open Smitherman said, "I'm the first to admit we've got a lot of work cut out for ourselves."

"We've got to get William Osler, the whole corporation, functioning well for each of the unique communities served by

Smitherman said he stepped in and said in the legislature that his government wouldn't support a plan to close obstetrics at the hospital because he felt the impact the closure would have on the community wasn't being adequately considered.


