## Red Cross reminds November is CPR month

November is CPR Month and the Red Cross reminds people that saving a life can be as easy as an afternoon, as that's all the time it takes to learn how to help a victim of cardiac arrest.

"People suffering from a heart attack may deny that anything is wrong," said Allison Goertzen, Community Services Co-ordinator

"You need to know how to recognize the signs of a heart attack and what to do in order to help save their life."

CPR training teaches people how to recognize the signs of a heart attack and to act quickly and effectively in an emergency situation. If someone near you is experiencing chest pain, nausea, or trouble

breathing, they could be having a heart attack. Knowing how to help can make the difference between their full recovery and permanent disability or even death.

### Yard Waste Tips

**Urban** Yard Waste is collected every other week on the same day as your Blue Box from April until December. For exact dates check your Curb Appeal Calendar.

#### Acceptable items include:

- yard and garden trimmings, pumpkins, fallen fruit from trees and tree trimmings.



#### Unacceptable items include:

- grass clippings, tree stumps, sod, soil and rocks.

#### Here are some tips for setting out your yard waste:

- Use **open**, reuseable, rigid containers such as a bushel basket or a garbage can (tip - drill holes in the bottom of your garbage can for drainage).
- Place a yard waste sticker on your **open**, reuseable container to identify that it is yard waste. Labels are available at no charge by calling Halton Region at 905-825-6000, Toll Free: 1-866-4HALTON (1-866-442-5866).
- Use paper yard waste bags to handle the overflow during high volume times.



Brush must be tied in bundles no larger than 1.2 m (4 ft) long by 0.6 m (2 ft) wide, with branches a maximum of 7.5 cm (3 inches) in diameter.



**Note:** Yard waste placed out in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected.



Yard waste placed out in decorative plastic Halloween bags will not be collected.

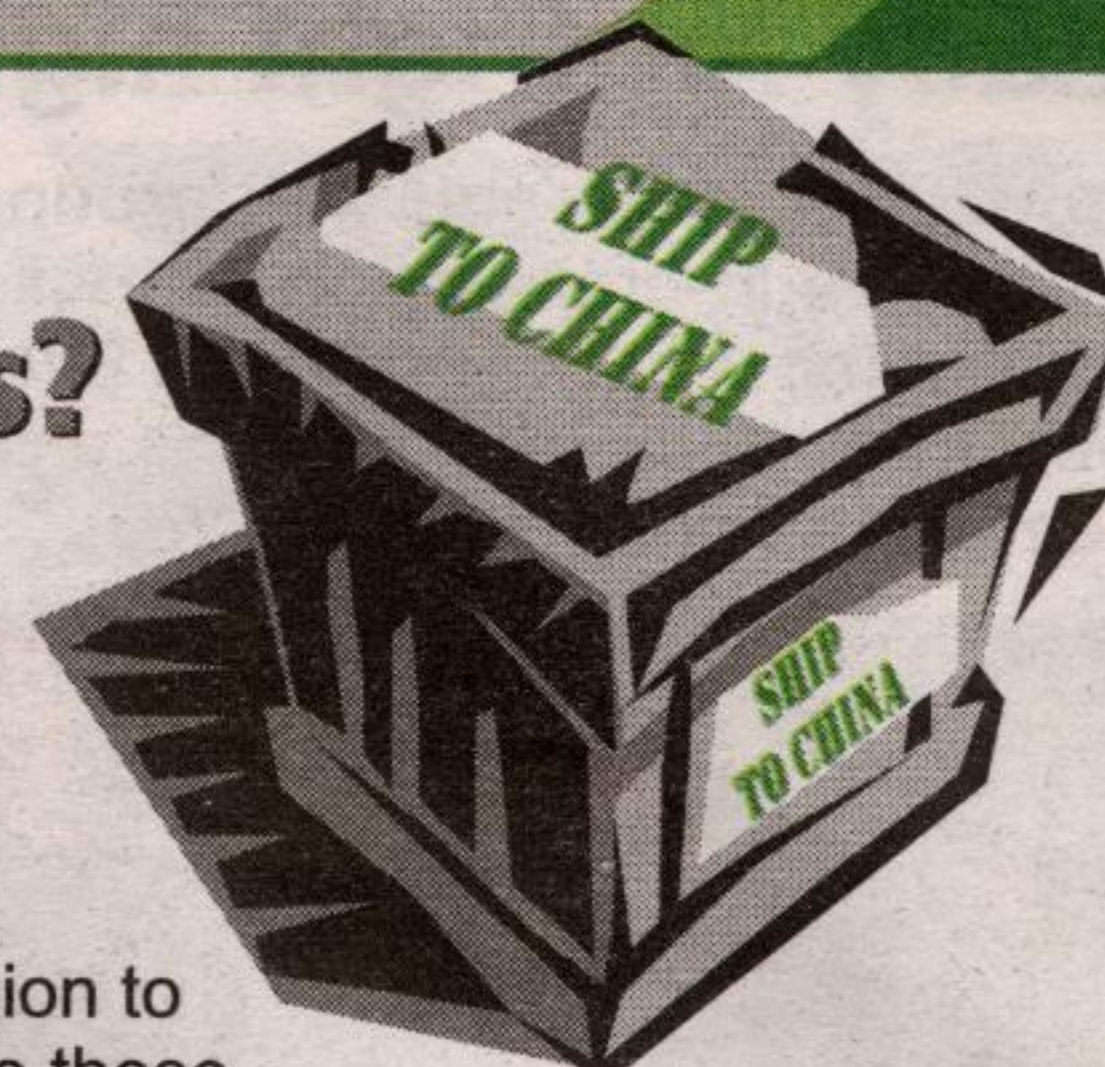
