Theatre Productions (GLT) is always looking for new talent.

Going strong for over 40 years, the troupe meets on the first Tuesday of each month in its 33 Stewarttown Rd, Stewarttown, at 8 p.m. (but come at 7:30 p.m. to socialize first).

Destroyed by fire in 1998, the members rebuilt their theatre home on the same site. It houses more than 70 members, all active in some way, says past president, Colin Hoare.

The GLT also has an active youth group. This group occasionally offers Saturday workshops where kids can learn about voice, mime, prop-building, and mask-making, as well as directing.

There is a core group of 25 members who are actively involved.

"We understand that not everyone

can be involved all the time. We wan this to be something they enjoy doing There are no strict requirements for membership," says co-ordinator, Ca Heaven.
