Adopt A Boulevard plan gets council OK

Talling them canvases waiting to be painted, a Halton Hills-based citi--zens' group heralded Halton Hills council's approval of an Adopt A Boulevard program.

HOPE (Healthy Options for People and the Environment) plans to work with town staff to "adopt" the first Sargent Rd. boulevard block, from Mountainview Rd. The group hopes to enlist the volunteer support of Sargent Rd. residents, including seniors in the

Sargent Rd. Apartments.

HOPE member Christine Upton said the program would bring town, businesses and residents together in a collaborative project. It will help "people reconnect with nature through gardening, demonstrating that we can beautify our neighbourhoods and also give something back to the environment which in turn gives us peace of mind."

More importantly, said Upton, it will educate the public by showcasing a variety of native perennials resistant to pests, ground covers and shrubs, rather than a "monoculture of grass always needing to be mowed

and protected from weeds." Town staff would remove the grass, supply the topsoil and install the recognition signs. The adopter (HOPE for instance) would be responsible for spreading the topsoil, preparing the planting bed, purchasing the plants, weeding and maintenance and communicating with the area residents. Design of the boulevard would be subject to town approval with regard to sightlines and other safety con-

cerns. HOPE has enlisted the help of master gardeners Belinda Gallagher and Diana Pooke to assist with the design. The group also plans to document the project to be used on the Town's website as an educational tool for

other volunteer groups who may want to adopt a boulevard in the future.

Other boulevards in town that are suitable locations to adopt include the boulevard island on Normandy Blvd. and the north side of Sinclair Rd., between Mountainview Rd. and Calvert Dr. Only one boulevard will be adopted each year.

The policy, which must be ratified at the Nov. 8 council meeting, is also contingent on council approval of a 2005 base budget request of \$500 in annual operating costs—equivalent to one new boulevard adoption a year.

TEAC (Town Environmental Advisory Committee) has agreed to pay for the \$500 this year to allow HOPE to begin work on the Sargent Rd. boulevard, with planting planned for spring 2005.


