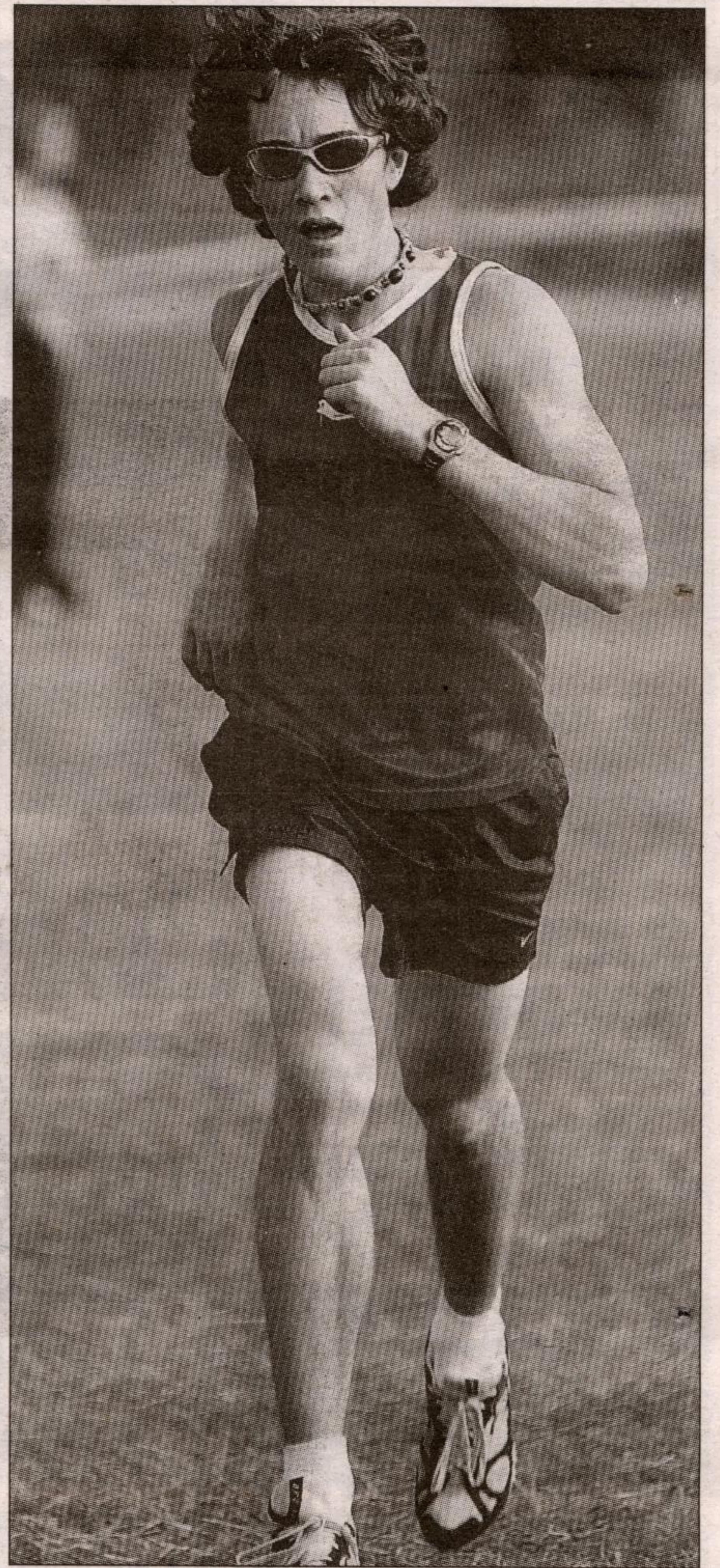
In other senior girls basketball action, Georgetown edged Bishop Reding 21-19.
